PUBLIC RELATIONS REPORT

MAPLE LEAF: For the past several months we had a significant number of copies of the Maple Leaf left over at the end of the month. So, we will reduce the number of black and white printed copies. If we run out early, we can print a few extra locally.

FACEBOOK PAGE ACTIVITY: At the February General Meeting a question was asked about the availability of any data that would show how successful (or not) our on-line Public Relations activities are, i.e. Facebook, website, etc. Numbers for our website are not available at this point, but our Facebook page provides a fairly detailed analysis of our readership. Overall, the numbers tell us that our page is doing remarkably well compared to other Facebook pages in the area. For example, in the seven day period before the March meeting, we had 2,207 people "reached", which is the number of people who saw one of our posts on their screen. Of those, 2,123 classified as "engagements", which means that these people took some action regarding what they saw, i.e. "shared" the post, or commented on the post, or clicked to "like" the post. This number is guite significant as it represents how much interest people take in our posts. A comparison with five other Facebook pages (three organizations in Coldwater and two other Legion branches) puts us way ahead of the others, at least for the period cited. Detailed numbers can be provided upon request.

BRANCH HISTORIAN REPORT

Articles about our branch Veterans and Coldwater's soldiers of the First World War were among the most read and commented about that were published in the Maple Leaf – and subsequently on our Facebook page and website. So far we have published 12 articles on local Veterans – authored by Comrade Rosalie Pratt - and three more are written and will be published in the next months. These articles have been very well received, and their subjects are now part of the documented history of this branch. Thank you Rosalie, and please keep them coming.

VIMY RIDGE DAY: On April 9 we will commemorate the 102nd anniversary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge, in which several Coldwater soldiers took part. Two soldiers from Coldwater, Private Andrew Durnford and George Maracle, were killed in action during the battle, and four more were killed within a few weeks in the ensuing fighting over the Vimy area. Representatives from the Coldwater Branch will be laying a wreath in memory of the Battle of Vimy Ridge at the Cenotaph at 1 p.m. on April 9.








INTRODUCING VETERAN JOHN C. O'HARA

An avid dart player, former Air Force Reservist John O'Hara is a familiar face at the Coldwater Branch, particularly on dart nights.

Comrade John comes from а military background. His father served in the Air during the Force Second World War. As youngster, John а served his community as an Air Cadet and after five years, he was given the opportunity to assist at the summer camp and teach the Glider Training Course. Comrade John relocated to another city where he assisted and pursued Air Cadet activities. Half-way through 1972, Comrade John decided to pursue a career path as a Reservist. He joined 400 "City of Toronto" Air Reserve Squadron, then located in Toronto (now based at CFB Borden), and worked as a mechanic on the

deHaviland DHC 3 Otter airplanes. As a Reservist he participated in military activities two nights a week and every second weekend.

He recalls that his choice was relatively stress-free as in his civilian life he worked on the repair, and maintenance of aircraft. While the regular (full-time) forces oversaw the invasive maintenance of the airplanes, it was quickly realized that Comrade John had work experience. Comrade John was responsible for regular maintenance, fueling, repairs, operability, and safety of the airplanes. Comrade John advanced in rank and when he decided to leave the Reserves in 1976 he did so with the rank of corporal.

Comrade John remembers weekends spent on training for bush survival. Normally, three airplanes would be on exercise each with a pilot, co-pilot plus at least three reservists. Bush training meant being out of normal communication reach; in an emergency the Squadron Office would contact a pilot and the message would be conveyed. Comrade John said that, *"Box lunches were pretty staple but if we were flying close to another base, we would take advantage by flying over, visiting and enjoying a hot meal."*

As a Reservist, Comrade John was able to pursue a civilian career as an automotive and aircraft mechanic. In 1976 he started a fresh career path with a new employer. This job required shift and weekend work which precluded Comrade John from continuing as a Reservist. For the following three plus decades John worked as a Millwright for the same company. After retirement, Comrade John was approached by his employer and he contracted with them for the next several years.

During the interview, Comrade John said, "everything you do, everything you experience and learn influences you somehow. These all go together to make up the total person you are in the future."

Comrade John has kept in touch with past colleagues, and several years ago attended the 75th Anniversary of 400 Squadron.

In closing the interview, Comrade John stated he transferred to our Branch as he is often in Coldwater and he enjoys the activities (he is an avid dart enthusiast), and social events offered by our Branch. His closing remarks...although in the Reserves a short time, he enjoyed the camaraderie and opportunity to meet a lot of diverse persons – the bonus, the opportunity of pursuing work already performed in civilian life.

We thank you for your service.
