OPEN HOUSE FOR LEGION CENTENARY

On Sunday, January 25, a small group of local people braved the threatening snow storm to make their way to the Coldwater branch and take part in the launch of our celebrations of the Royal Canadian Legion's Centenary year: yes, 100 years this year! Many of the guests were coming to be initiated as new members of the Legion – and the Coldwater branch, joining under the special Centenary year programme for 2026. Welcome aboard comrades!

During the event new members were welcomed into the branch by President Kari Malmström, and given some information about our programmes by key representatives of the branch. Guests were able to browse through dozens of photo albums covering decades of local Legion activities at the branch. And then we all enjoyed the cake!

The story of the Royal Canadian Legion finds its origins in the First World War - referred to at the time as "The Great War" - when Canadian soldiers started coming back home from the battlefields of France and Belgium, many wounded or ill, looking for medical, financial, or moral support in their communities. Veterans started forming up in associations, the main one being the Great War Veterans Association formed in 1917. By 1925 the various associations across the country decided to unite under one national level association called the Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League. It was incorporated by an Act of Parliament on July 17, 1926, date which is considered the birth date of the Royal Canadian Legion. There were several milestones along the way in the evolution from that 1926 association to the current Royal Canadian Legion, including dropping off the words "British Empire" in 1959 and the addition of the prefix "Royal", approved by Queen Elizabeth II in 1961. In the 1970s a policy shift regarding eligibility to join the Legion changed what had hitherto been a Veterans-only association, to one that included Associate and Affiliate categories of membership. One hundred years after its birth, the Royal Canadian Legion is open to all Veterans, their relatives and supporters. Yet its main aims today remain supporting Veterans, and promoting Remembrance.



It is always a pleasure to connect with you and share updates on provincial initiatives that matter to our seniors, along with highlights of upcoming community events and warm wishes for the months ahead.

Supporting seniors in our community remains a top priority for our government. I am proud that the Province of Ontario continues to invest in programs that help older adults stay active, independent, and connected. Through the Seniors Community Grant Program, more than one hundred thousand dollars has been invested locally in Simcoe North to support projects that reduce social isolation and

encourage participation in community life. These grants help fund programs that bring people together, support mental and physical wellbeing, and strengthen the sense of belonging that is so important as we age.

Another important announcement for seniors in 2025, was Ontario's permanent funding commitment to the Community Paramedicine for Long Term Care program. By focusing on prevention and early intervention, this program helps seniors remain independent longer while also easing pressure on hospitals and emergency services. Families and residents of all ages are invited to enjoy a free Family Day roller skating event at the Roller Skating Place, ODAS Park. GINGER, ISABELLA JEAN (NÉE FALLOON)

Isabella Jean Falloon was born in Hamilton, Ont., on August 16, 1920, daughter of Thomas and Mary Falloon. She enlisted in the Canadian Women Army Corps on October 16, 1942. She served for two years as a lab technician in Canada, including a post as an instructor for CWAC recruits at No. 20 Canadian Army (Basic) Training Centre in Brantford, Ont. While in service she met her husband-to-be, Reginald (Reg) Arthur Ginger of the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps. Isabella took her release from the CWAC on December 6, 1944, and they got married in June 1945. Her husband stayed in the service for 21 years, so the family moved around to military communities including Toronto, Camp Borden, Ont. (three times), Shilo, Man., Hemer, Germany, and Le Havre, France. After Reg's return to civilian life the family lived in Acton, Ont., until he passed away in 1981. Isabella moved to Coldwater, Ont., in 2004, where she passed away on April 21, 2008. She is resting with her husband at the Fairview Cemetery in Acton.

LEGION LETTER TO PRIME MINISTER: ON SOVEREIGNTY, FREEDOM, AND AFGHANISTAN

Organization calls remarks a “global wake-up call”
From the files of Dominion Command

OTTAWA, ON, 30 January 2026 – The Royal Canadian Legion has issued a formal letter to Mark Carney, Prime Minister of Canada, in the wake of recent talks at the NATO meeting in Davos, Switzerland. The letter encompasses the organization’s reaction to remarks made internationally by the Prime Minister and addresses Canada’s role in Afghanistan. The content of the letter is reproduced below and can also be found on Legion.ca.

Dear Prime Minister,

We write to you on behalf of The Royal Canadian Legion in a time of unprecedented attacks by the United States’ administration on our sovereignty as a strong and independent nation. We would like to commend your recent remarks on the world stage in Davos, which provided a clear and important statement in support of the essential values that Canadians – and all who believe in freedom – hold dear. Your remarks were both needed and provided a global “wake-up call.”

These values are of great importance to the Legion, in alignment with its founding principles which were established by First World War Veterans one hundred years ago, in 1926. Many thousands of Canadians have fought and died for these same values throughout our history and all over the world.

We were therefore appalled to hear the President of the United States share his view that troops from other NATO countries had played an inconsequential role in Afghanistan. Our country’s mission there saw over 40,000 troops deployed, and 158 Canadian Armed Forces members gave their lives. It is completely unacceptable that the outstanding service and selfless sacrifice of so many allied troops, including Canadians, was trivialized.

Especially given they were part of the response to the 9/11 attacks on America. We cannot stay silent when hurtful untruths are shared on a global scale.

It is not the norm for us to comment on speeches by national leaders, however the Legion shares the values you have articulated, and we believe it is critical that we show our clear support at this time.

We thank you for your inspiring words which truly met the moment. Please know that The Royal Canadian Legion stands ready to support Canada and Canadians across this country as we navigate these troubled waters together.




