#### LEGION PUBLIC SPEAKING COMPETITION IN COLDWATER

On Sunday February 24, the annual Royal Canadian Legion/Ontario Command Public Speaking Contest was held at Branch 270 Coldwater. Young contestants ranging from Grade 2 to Grade 8 took turns at delivering their own original speech in front of judges and an audience of family and friends. Congratulations to all participants, particularly to Fletcher Desroches, who won the Grades 1 - 3 category with a talk about the practice of Kempo karate, and Michael Prynn, who took first place in the Grades 7 – 9 category by sharing his experience of moving to Coldwater, comparing it to being part of the three-ring circus of life, yet "The Greatest Show on Earth." Arissa Dixon, a Grade 8 student, took 2<sup>nd</sup> place in that category with an interesting presentation on air, water and land pollution and its damage to the environment. The two 1<sup>st</sup> place winners will now progress to the next level in March.

The Public Speaking Contest, part of the Legion's Youth and Education program, is meant to give young people an opportunity to speak in public. Participants get to choose their own subject matter for the address. The contest takes place annually at each Legion branch, and winners progress through zone, district and area levels, concluding at the Provincial level in May of each year. The contestants are divided into four classes: Grades 1-3; Grades 4-6; Grades 7-9; and Grades 10-12. Coldwater Branch will be hosting the Area Competition Sunday, April 28 at 1 p.m.


#### SPORTS OFFICER REPORT



#### INTRODUCING MEMBER PATRICK MURPHY

Comrade Patrick 'Pat' Murphy vividly remembers his childhood. In the early years, Phelpston, Ontario boasted over one hundred thirty-one persons and everyone knew everyone. Surrounded by many uncles, Pat especially remembers Uncle Joe, an Ontario Provincial Police officer who was a wireless air-gunner in the Second World War. Comrade Pat knew he wanted to follow his footsteps. With regrets he recalls that medical issues prevented his attempts to enlist with the Ontario Provincial Police and the military. Nonetheless, Pat is happy about pursuing work as an independent contractor. His first job was with a lighting company which handled deliveries every Friday. The delivery man was an avid curry spice lover. To this day, our Pat finds curry malodorous. In his forties, Pat owned and operated his own business. Now he is pursuing new business opportunities, which are proving to be an adventure.

Comrade Pat recalls the day when during the Cuban crisis, armoured trucks drove through Phelpston, and he was beaming when he delivered the twenty-five cent Toronto Star and followed astronaut Neil Armstrong's moon landing.

Comrade Pat has been a member of Branch 270 fifteen plus years and is proud to be a volunteer Bar Steward. Pat is especially pleased that the bar volunteers are referred to as Stewards, not bartenders. He points out that our Stewards are the face of the Branch inasmuch as they foster goodwill, providing non-judgmental, friendly service with a caring attitude. "A bartender pours a drink; a Steward is the face of the Branch." Comrade Pat stated that being a member of the Legion "ties you to history; being a member of a Branch ties you to the community." He is not afraid of making mistakes as "mistakes allow you to grow, develop and move forward".

In hindsight Pat claims that in his youth he should have paid more attention to maintaining good health "but in my twenties, I was enjoying the Roaring Twenties lifestyle". Today he strives to surround himself with positive people and makes the time to listen to our young persons' points of view. Ask Pat what makes him happy and he quickly answers, "My family, and watching and helping people enjoy life." The legacy he would like to leave each of his children is a thriving business enterprise.


