### **BSO LEGION OSI**

Help Support Veterans with Mental Injuries and Illness

The Legion Operational Stress Injury Special Section (BSO Legion OSI) is looking for Legion members to join the Section and help make a difference for Veterans affected by mental illness and operational stress injuries.

Mental illness is one of the most widespread health issues in Canada, and The Royal Canadian Legion is committed to ensuring Veterans and their families have access to the supports and services they need. BSO Legion OSI is a national, member-driven initiative working to support and strengthen the Legion's ability to respond to the needs of the Veteran community.

BSO Legion OSI is a peer support network that will provide enhanced outreach, support and referral services for Veterans and their families who are affected by operational stress injuries including anxiety, depression, addictions, PTSD or other mental health issues. In addition to helping Veterans get the support and assistance they need, BSO Legion OSI promotes mental health information, helps dispel the stigma of mental illness, and supports Legion advocacy efforts.

Membership in BSO Legion OSI is open to any Legion Member who is a Veteran, or direct family member of a Veteran. Members support the BSO Legion OSI mandate by:

- coordinating and conducting outreach activities in the community
- helping to identify and refer any Veteran or their family member who needs help with an OSI issue to a Legion Command Service Officer for support
- providing information on local programs and resources that may be of help

- promoting mental health information and helping dispel the stigma of mental illness, and
- supporting advocacy efforts and information sharing at the Branch, Provincial Command and National levels



### FROM THE BRANCH PRESIDENT



Happy February everyone!

After a pretty mild January, looks like we're finally in real winter, with snow AND cold. For some of you, we probably could have done without. But for others (I'm looking at you sledders and skiers), it's about time. We're already at Groundhog Day!

We do have some good news at the branch. With the blessing of the provincial government, we're reopening the bar and indoor dining on Tuesday, February 1<sup>st</sup>, albeit with some restrictions. Hours of operation will be our regular hours, Tuesday to Saturday, 11:30 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. We will operate at 50% capacity, and of course the proof of vaccination requirement is still in effect. Another announcement of a different kind of financial support from the provincial government is a new, free, social gaming licence that will allow legions and other local community groups to host small stakes games like bridge, euchre and bingo. Legions and charities will also benefit from new opportunities to fundraise through progressive jackpot (loonie and toonie) raffle lotteries. Our Ways & Means Chair, Carol Baird, and I attended a Zoom information session on this, set up by MPP Dunlop's office. The benefits from this initiative will only come once we can fully reopen and actually have people in the branch to take part in these small scale lotteries.

The Ontario Provincial Convention is coming up May 14-18, 2022, in North Bay. It's still too early to know if we will send someone to represent the branch.

For now, we just have to be patient. Stay safe, get your shots, and wear your masks where required. Hopefully (I use that word a little too often these days), we will be able to hold General Meetings soon, maybe even an election in May!



### THIS MONTH WE REMEMBER

### THE BLACK BATTALION

On July 5, 1916, the No.2 Construction Battalion was formed in Pictou, Nova Scotia—the largest Black military unit in Canadian history. Recruitment took place across the country and approximately 800 personnel would serve with the battalion at some point during the First World War. The segregated battalion was tasked with non-combat support roles. Its members were sent to eastern France later in 1917, where they served honourably with the Canadian Forestry Corps. The unit was officially disbanded in 1920. In addition to the men of the Black Battalion, more than 700 Black Canadians also managed to join other units. They would offer distinguished service that earned some of them medals for bravery at places like Ypres, Vimy Ridge, Hill 70 and Passchendaele. Source: Veterans Affairs Canada

### **HONOURS & AWARDS REPORT**



### REMEMBERING HAROLD SALLOWS

Harold Sallows was born in Victoria Harbour, Ontario, on May 12, 1891, son of Reuben and Britannia Sallows. On February 12, 1916, he enlisted in the Army in Coldwater, with the Canadian Expeditionary Force (CEF). He was 24 years old and married. With his wife Jessie, they had two young boys, Reginald (2) and Manley Harold (1 month). Harold listed his trade as labourer, and had no previous military experience. Private Sallows, regimental number 644031, sailed on the S.S. Cameronia to arrive in England on October 28, 1916. After getting some training in England, he landed in France on November 29, 1916, assigned to the 1st Canadian Infantry Battalion (Western Ontario Regiment). Private Sallows suffered a gunshot wound on May 3, 1917, while serving in the Vimy area. He was repatriated to Canada and discharged as medically unfit for service on March 20, 1918. He passed away on December 4, 1971.



Harold Sallows was wounded in the First World War. His brothers Lorne and David also served in the Canadian Expeditionary Force.

### LEGION SUPPORTS AWARDING VICTORIA CROSS TO AFGHANISTAN VETERAN – FOLLOW-UP

In the January issue of The Maple Leaf we published an article from Dominion Command that supported the awarding of the Victoria Cross to Private Jess Larochelle for his actions on the battlefield in Afghanistan, in 2006. The following letter from Trevor Jenvenne, President of BSO Legion OSI Special Section, provides more details on Private Larochelle's actions on that day.

The Royal Canadian Legion Operational Stress Injury Special Section supports the efforts to award Canadian soldier Jess Larochelle the Canadian Victoria Cross. It is the country's highest honour for bravery, valour, self-sacrifice and devotion to duty when in the presence of an enemy.

On October 14, 2006, Pte Larochelle after being hit by the blast of a RPG, refused to give up the fight. He faced close to what we knew a platoon size force of Taliban. Using rockets that had been compromised in the blast, he single handily used them to close with and destroy the enemy, so that they could not take the fight to his own platoon. He did it with a broken back. Not only did he show real morale courage that day, his devotion to his fellow soldiers and a mustering of superhuman strength no doubt saved countless Canadian lives.

For his actions that day he was awarded the Star of Military Valour.

Jess Larochelle's official Citation reads;

"On October 14, 2006, Private Larochelle of the 1st Royal Canadian Regiment Battle Group was manning an observation post when it was destroyed by an enemy rocket in Pashmul, Afghanistan. Although he was alone, severely injured, and under sustained enemy fire in his exposed position at the ruined observation post, he aggressively provided covering fire over the otherwise undefended flank of his company's position. While two members of the personnel were killed and three others were wounded in the initial attack, Private Larochelle's heroic actions permitted

the remainder of the company to defend their battle positions and to successfully fend off the sustained attack of more than 20 insurgents. His valiant conduct saved the lives of many members of his company."

We feel that Jess Larochelle's actions that day more than qualify him for the Victoria Cross. We urge the Government of Canada and the Canadian Armed Forces to review Pte Larochelle's actions that day and award him the medal that best fits his heroic actions that day, the Victoria Cross.
