COLDWATER LEGION MEMBERS REMEMBER THE BATTLE OF BRITAIN



On Sunday, September 16, Royal Canadian Legion Coldwater Branch President, Betty-Jean Murray, and Branch 1st Vice-President, Norm Marion, took part in the annual Battle of Britain parade downtown Barrie. The event, which marked the 78th anniversary of the Battle of Britain, was organized by members of RCAF 441 (Huron) Wing, 16 Wing Borden, and the City of Barrie.

The parade saw a wide spectrum of participants including current members of the Canadian Armed Forces, Veterans, First Responders and several groups of Royal Canadian Air Cadets. Comrades Murray and Marion laid a wreath on behalf of the Coldwater Branch at the Barrie Cenotaph during the ceremony. They also laid a wreath back at the Coldwater Cenotaph later in the day.

The Battle of Britain is widely recognized as one of the greatest air battles of all times, and is considered by many to be the turning point of the Second World War. It was fought between July 10 and October 31, 1940, over the southern part of England and the English Channel.

BRANCH AT THE FALL FAIR

From September 28 to 30, members of RCL Branch 270 Coldwater took part in various ways in the annual Coldwater Fall Fair. THIS MONTH WE REMEMBER

Private James Richardson, V.C.

On October 8, 1916, during the latter stages of the Battle of The Somme, Private James Richardson, a piper with the 16th Battalion, Canadian Expeditionary Force, stood up holding his bagpipes in full view of the enemy. He strode back and forth, calmly playing his bagpipes, as his company attacked a German defensive position named Regina Trench, inspiring the men to capture their objective. He then helped to recover the wounded, but was killed while trying to retrieve his bagpipes. For his actions he was posthumously awarded the Victoria Cross.

BRANCH HISTORIAN REPORT

After months of research and getting quotations for a plaque to honour the 23 Coldwater soldiers killed in action during the First World War, we decided to go with Signature Memorials in Orillia. The quote is for \$1,750.00 plus HST. The plaque will be in black granite rather than bronze for several reasons such as cost, delivery time, suitability, security, and the fact that it will be made locally. They will also clean our Cenotaph for free as part of a program they have for Veterans memorials. Fundraising for the plaque has gone very well. So far we have raised close to \$1000 through special activities, like the Canada Day dunk tank, and more than \$4,500 in direct donations resulting from a letter-writing campaign, for a total of \$5,546.35. Any donated monies surplus to what is needed for the plaque itself and the landscaping required around the Cenotaph will be spent on related project(s) such as lighting for the Cenotaph or a second, smaller plaque for the four Second World War soldiers killed in action.

The last three tributes to fallen Coldwater soldiers were paid last month with Lance-Corporal William Middleton, killed in action on September 29, 1918, and Privates Joseph Borrow and William Caswell, both killed on the 30th. These were the last of the 23 Coldwater soldiers whose names will appear on the Armistice 100 plaque.



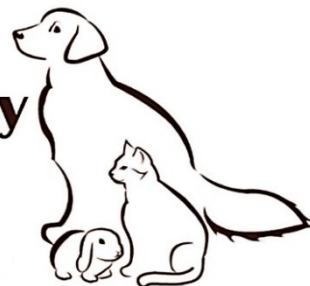

COLDWATER REMEMBERS LANCE CORPORAL WILLIAM RUSSELL MIDDLETON

On September 29, 2018, the Coldwater Legion lowered its flags to half-mast in honour of Lance Corporal William Russell Middleton, D.C.M., of Coldwater, who was killed in action 100 years ago while serving on the front lines in France.

William Russell Middleton was born in Medonte Township near Coldwater, on October 23, 1891, the son of Isaac and Mary Ann Middleton. On February 23, 1916, Russell enlisted in Orillia with the 157th Overseas Battalion of the Canadian Expeditionary Force. He was 25 years old and single. On his Attestation Form he is described as 5 feet 9½ inches tall, with brown eyes and brown hair. He identified his religious denomination as Methodist, and his trade as farmer, with no previous military experience.

Private W. Russell Middleton, regimental number 644073, sailed to England on the S.S. Cameronia, arriving on October 28, 1916. After training in England for several months, he landed in France and on July 27, 1917, he joined his front line unit, the 116th Canadian Infantry Battalion, part of the 3rd Canadian Division. He was appointed to the rank of Lance-Corporal on August 27, 1918.

Lance-Corporal Middleton was killed in action on September 29, 1918, during what became known as the "100 Day" final advance in the area of Cambrai. There are no details on how he was killed.

On October 17, 1918, Lance-Corporal Middleton was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal (D.C.M.), the second highest award for gallantry in action (after the Victoria Cross) for all army ranks below commissioned officers. The award was officially published in the London Gazette on June 14, 1919. The citation for the award speaks for itself:

"On the 8th August, 1918, near Domart, he was the means of capturing three enemy machine guns. On one occasion when the platoon was held up by machine gun fire he advanced across the open, firing his gun from the hip, and, although under heavy machine gun fire himself, he put out of action the gun he attacked, and made prisoners the entire crew of seven men."

Lance-Corporal Middleton was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal (D.C.M.), the second highest award for gallantry in action, after the Victoria Cross.



Lance-Corporal William Russell Middleton is buried at Crest Cemetery, 3 km of Cambrai, France. He is commemorated on page 470 of the *First World War Book of Remembrance*, located inside the Memorial Chamber in the Peace Tower in Ottawa. He is also commemorated on a plaque inside the Willis Presbyterian Church in Oro-Medonte.

We will remember him.

INTRODUCING VETERAN STEVEN ZEIDLER

After high school graduation, Comrade Steve Zeidler stated that a Recruitment Officer offered him the opportunity to join the artillery, which was down this young gentleman's avenue as he enjoys camping and hunting. With a birthday on 11.11, it was practically pre-ordained that the military would be his home for the next twenty years.

In 1985 he joined the army where he served in the artillery until 1994. He recalls being homesick during his early training days but by age 19 he was in Germany and new life adventures were waiting.

Comrade Steve re-mustered to the Air Force (1994-2006) where for the next five years he trained as a Water, Fuel and Environmental Technician (WFE Tech). His responsibilities were the water/sewage plants, fuel farms and conducting environmental studies. He recounts his proudest moment was when, after five years of training, he participated in his graduation ceremony having completed the Journeyman's Course. These competencies allowed him to carry forth in civilian life as a Civil Engineer.

Comrade Steve served throughout our country, Europe and the Middle East. From Petawawa, Ontario he was posted to Lahr, Germany for the next five years. While in service, Comrade Steve kept in touch with family by telephone and remarked that the food was good and plentiful and they were well supplied with equipment to do their job. Comrade Steve hinted that this was more than a job; it was an adventure he would replicate in a heart-beat.

Comrade Steve has been hosting the High Noon Navy/Sailor weekend for the past several summers. Earlier this summer, he along with twenty-plus Navy Veterans from across Canada came to visit our Branch and spent time with our Branch Veterans.

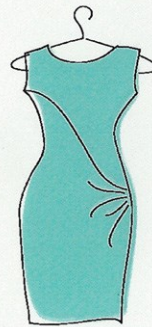
Sergeant Steven Zeidler was at CFB Borden when he was medically released from service. He now pursues the family business, the Matchedash Camp Ground.

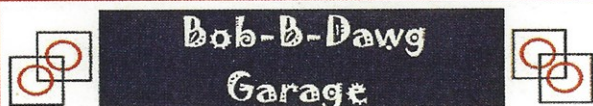
