### THANK YOU (AGAIN) COLDWATER

Thank you again Coldwater! The month of November saw much activity at the Coldwater Legion, focused for the most part on Remembrance and Veterans appreciation. The month began with our annual Veterans Appreciation Dinner on November 3, with a special musical performance by the Georgian Sound Big Band. The event was well attended and everyone had a great time. A Branch Colour Party also took part in a special Remembrance Service the next day at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church. Then our annual Remembrance Day ceremony was held at the Cenotaph on the 11th, also very well attended despite a weather forecast of chilling temperature and snow squalls. Thank you to all who attended. This year's ceremony was particularly significant since we commemorated the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the signing of the 1918 Armistice that put an end to the Great War. In Coldwater, we marked this important milestone with the unveiling of a plaque with the names of the 23 local soldiers who made the ultimate sacrifice in the First World War. And on a national level, people from communities across the country - including Coldwater - rang church bells 100 times at sunset on November 11, as part of the Bells of Peace initiative to mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the 1918 Armistice.




