REMEMBRANCE PROJECT LAUNCHED ON CANADA DAY

Summer is finally here, and by the time you read this, Canada Day celebrations will already be behind us. As we enjoy our favourite outdoor activities during those hot, sunny days, it may seem a bit premature to start talking about November 11 and Remembrance Day projects. And yet, that is exactly what we do at the Coldwater Legion.

This year will mark the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War - or "The Great War", as it was known until there was a Second World War. To mark this important milestone, the Coldwater Legion is making plans to have a bronze plaque cast with the names of the 23 soldiers from Coldwater who were killed in action or died as a result of wounds received in action during the First World War. The plaque will be unveiled during this year's Remembrance Day ceremony at the Coldwater Cenotaph.

Over the past few years, the Coldwater Legion has paid individual tributes to those fallen soldiers by posting short biographies and lowering the flags to half-mast on the day of the 100th anniversary of their passing. The bronze plaque will offer a more lasting tribute, accessible year round to visitors at the Cenotaph.

In the following months, members of the Legion will be involved in various fundraising activities in support of this project. The Canada Day Dunk Tank was the first event of the campaign. SERGEANT-AT-ARMS REPORT



THIS MONTH WE REMEMBER:

KOREA

July 27, 2018, will mark the 65th anniversary of the Korean War armistice between North and South Korea. Canadian Forces were involved in the 1950–1953 Korean War and its aftermath, as 26,000 Canadians participated on the side of the United Nations. Canada sent eight destroyers while Canadian aircraft provided transport, supply and logistics. 516 Canadians died, 312 of which were from combat. After the war, Canadian troops remained for three years as military observers. Technically, the two sides are still at war, although recent events suggest a possible peace agreement in the near future.



COLLECTION MANAGER/HISTORIAN REPORT

Submitted by Norm Marion, Collection Manager/Historian The rough estimate for the brass plaque with the names of the 23 soldiers from Coldwater killed in action during the First World War is between \$2,500 and \$3,000, depending on the final dimensions required and shipping cost, etc. (It's quite heavy!). Also in support of this project, a quote was submitted for landscaping work around the Cenotaph, which will be necessary for the plaque project. More estimates will be obtained for both parts of the project before we proceed with placing orders. An amount of \$3,000 was approved for the project through a motion at the June 27 General Meeting. A fundraising campaign will take place during the coming months to cover the cost of the project.

The next tribute to a fallen Coldwater soldier will be this month on July 26 for Private Herbert James Duddy, who was killed in action in France on July 26, 1918. Flags at the branch will be lowered and a short biography will be posted on the day of the 100th anniversary of his passing.

Finally, please note that the title for the position of Branch Collection Manager is now changed to Branch Historian. This will better reflect the various aspects of the history and heritage projects on-going at the branch.



INTRODUCING VETERAN ALEXANDER E. WILLIAMS

This ninety-plus year old comrade's passion for the sea was natural as in the First World War, his father was a sailor in the navy.

From 1943 to 1946 Comrade Alexander served with the Royal Navy in Newfoundland. At this time, Newfoundland was not part of Canada. However, the Royal Navy followed almost identical rules and protocol as the Royal Canadian Navy.


One of the Royal Navy rules was that they would not deploy the eldest son to a war zone. In 1943, the Royal Navy was on their second or second to last recruitment effort to send troops to England; they needed thirty-five men and had seventeen recruits. The men were sent back to the HMS Avalon where they were assigned jobs on the base such as delivering for the Fleet Mail Office; servicing gasoline needs to the ships, providing boiler cleaning service, loading torpedoes, ammunition, depth chargers and stores onto the various ships.

In 1946 Comrade Alexander was offered a five-year renewal contract. Comrade Alexander made the difficult and reluctant decision to leave naval service and return to civilian life. Well-trained as an Able Seaman (Stoker), he pursued a job with British American Oil until his move to Ontario where he worked at Queen's Park as a Stationery Engineer (a skill learned in the Navy). Next he had a lengthy career with the Ministry of Correctional Services where he served as Assistant Superintendent of the Don Jail and several other correctional institutions on a temporary basis for thirty-six years.

Some of his most memorable experiences include taking delivery of German prisoners of war, picking up Norwegian casualties and delivering mail to the torpedoed ship, City of Dieppe – he said, "you could row right through the ship." Comrade Alexander is an accomplished snare-drummer and taught bandsmen in the Royal Regiment of Canada and was an Executive Member of Branch 446 for ten years. In closing the interview, Comrade Alexander shared that his experiences in the Royal Navy were positive. When asked for comments regarding Branch 270, he expressed he is pleased. He mentioned that he is aware of the work put forth by our Service Officer and shared that he was

pleasantly surprised by the kindness of the Ladies Auxiliary
