1948 RCAF Flyers

Following the Second World War, the 1948 Winter Olympic Games were held in St. Moritz, Switzerland. Many of the players on the Royal Canadian Air Force Flyers hockey team, representing Canada, were Veterans of the war. Despite a challenging tournament, the men finished in first place, winning Olympic gold on February 8. In 2000, the 1948 Royal Canadian Air Force Flyers' gold medal win was selected as the "greatest moment in Canadian Armed Forces sports history" and the team was inducted into the Canadian Olympics Hall of Fame in 2008.

LEGION REVOKES MEMBERSHIP OF INDIVIDUALS FOR STOLEN VALOUR

Legion issues lifetime membership ban due to stolen valour for the first time

OTTAWA, ON, 20 JANUARY, 2020 – The Royal Canadian Legion, in an unprecedented move has revoked the membership of two members found to have engaged in "Stolen Valour."

"The Legion takes the issue of Stolen Valour very seriously," says Dominion President Thomas D. Irvine, CD. "Anyone who makes illegitimate claims of service or sacrifice degrades the honour of those who have served and brings tremendous discredit upon this organization. I cannot stand by to see the good name and deeds of the Legion tarnished by such discreditable conduct." The lifetime membership ban of one member in Ontario and another in British Columbia came over the weekend, after inquiries into each case ended. The Legion investigated allegations regarding the members' military service and the wearing of medals they had allegedly not earned. Mr. Irvine shared his decision with the Legion's Dominion Executive Council after outlining the steps he had taken before reaching his landmark decision, in accordance with the Legion's General By-Laws. "I provided each individual an opportunity to rebut the alleged evidence of their unfounded service claims and wearing of unearned medals; their submissions were without merit," he explains. Expulsion from the Legion can come after the Legion's own complaint process, or its Dominion President can revoke membership after inquiry and for cause.

In addition, The Royal Canadian Legion has just passed a new by-law amendment stating that anyone convicted under section 419 of the Criminal Code of Canada will be automatically expelled from the Legion.

Upon being elected to the role of Dominion President in 2018, Irvine had expressed his plans to take a strong

stance against Stolen Valour as part of his mandate. The Legion believes Stolen Valour is stolen service.

THE LEGION'S "LEAVE THE STREETS BEHIND" PROGRAM

"Leave the Streets Behind" is the Legion's national homeless Veterans program that started out of Ontario Command. The program's mission is to reach out to homeless Veterans and those at-risk of homelessness and provide them with immediate financial assistance and support. It also connects them with the social and community services to establish a long term solution to meet their needs.

While the "Leave the Streets Behind" program is operating in Ontario, British Columbia/Yukon, Alberta/North West Territories, Saskatchewan, Nova Scotia/Nunavut and New Brunswick Commands, supports and services through the Legion are available for homeless and near-homeless Veterans and their families across the country.

Partnering to support Veterans

The circumstances that can lead to homelessness can involve many issues, from mental illness, to financial challenges, to family circumstances, to failures with the system, and much more. In the Veteran community, homelessness can impact not only the Veteran, but their family as well.

The Legion is actively involved in advocating for supports and solutions for homeless Veterans. It was the Legion who hosted the first homeless Veterans Forum in 2014, bringing together industry experts, government representatives, Veterans organizations and community support services together for the first time. We continue to be fully involved in working to find solutions, coordinating the Legion's Veterans Homelessness Advisory Committee to help develop a coordinated approach across all stakeholders to address the issue.

The Legion works hard to get the word out to Veterans and their families about the help available. Our homeless Veterans program outreaches to shelters, first responders and organizations within communities to spread the word about our services and to coordinate supports for Veterans and their families in need. If you, or a Veteran or family member you know is homeless or at-risk of homelessness, contact a Legion Veterans Service Officer.



INTRODUCING LADIES AUXILIARY LIFE MEMBER ALIDA TURNER

Forty years ago, Branch Member Comrade Alida would join her husband and father-in-law when they visited Branch 270. Always, she was asked to consider joining the Ladies Auxiliary. Thirty-seven years ago she switched her affiliation but continues to support the efforts of the Branch.

Comrade Alida's early years were spotted by shift-work but she managed to provide assistance as needed. Three, four decades ago, the Ladies prepared all foods in the comfort of their home (and at their personal expense). Today, all foods must be prepared on our premises. Costs are covered by a stream of revenue from the Auxiliary.

Comrade Alida has enjoyed several Chairmanships. For a total of six years, (two separate terms of three years each), she served as Sergeant-at-Arms. She also undertook the positions of Secretary/Treasurer for a period of two years. For ten years, she has been the Telephone Committee Chairperson. Since 1989 she has been the voice behind the Sick and Visiting telephone calls and the author of numerous get-well and thinking of you notes to our Ladies Auxiliary members and our Branch Veterans.

In 2014, she was presented (a little late) the Life Membership Award for contributing twenty continuous years of service. Comrade Alida shared that this was a proud moment, and that she has never regretted her affiliation with the Ladies Auxiliary. She commented, "I have had the privilege of working with amazing women, and made new friends. I refuse to find fault. I look for the good. I have enjoyed opportunities to help our community, and our members. Reaching out to our Veterans is the most rewarding."

Comrade Alida was asked to share some comments and she offered the following:

- Encourage young women to join and volunteer as often as they can;
- She would like to have more social opportunities for our Veterans and their families – perhaps something similar to the Veterans' Dinner but during the summer months;
