VIMY RIDGE COMMEMORATED

On April 9, 2025, Royal Canadian Legion Branch 270 Coldwater Past President, Comrade Norm Marion, laid a wreath at the Cenotaph in memory of those Canadian soldiers who fought - and too many who died - at the Battle of Vimy Ridge on that day in 1917. The national flag at the Cenotaph was lowered to half-mast for the day to mark the anniversary of the battle. Branches of the Royal Canadian Legion across the country also commemorate the battle in this manner.

Square point of sale terminals are now up and running. Our members and patrons have responded positively as we now have the ability to take credit and debit card payments. Our Bar Stewards are also getting comfortable with the new system. We are in the early stages and to date it is proving to not only be convenient but also cost effective. Our average cost at this time is \$1.60 per every \$100.00 spent using a debit/credit card. Finally, we have also made sure to protect our investment with surge protectors.


- With the good weather, the roof section that had the leak above the upstairs kitchen has been replaced.

MESSAGE FROM MPP JILL DUNLOP

A Look Back on March and April: MPP Jill Dunlop Reflects on Ontario's Response to the Ice Storm

As Ontario recovers from the ice storm that struck in late March and early April, I want to take a moment to reflect on the tremendous efforts made by our communities, first responders, and emergency teams

As the newly appointed Minister of Emergency Preparedness and Response, it has been an honour to witness such resilience during this challenging time. Simcoe North, my home riding, was particularly hard hit by the storm. Many residents faced extended power outages, dangerous road conditions, and fallen trees blocking access to homes. The ice storm left its mark on local infrastructure, but our communities came together to support one another. I was deeply moved by the strength and resilience of Simcoe North, as neighbours helped neighbours and local volunteers stepped up to assist, and as the Ontario Corps moved swiftly into action to help our communities.

In response, we prioritized the safety of our residents, working with local municipalities and emergency teams to restore power and clear debris. Over 2,000 wellness checks were conducted across the affected areas, ensuring that vulnerable residents received the support they needed. In Simcoe North, crews worked tirelessly to restore electricity and ensure that essential services were available as quickly as possible.

As I said during the storm, "When emergencies happen, getting boots on the ground quickly can make all the difference to ensure life-saving actions are taken." I am incredibly grateful for the efforts of hydro workers, first responders, and volunteers in Simcoe North who answered the call. Their dedication has been essential to our recovery. Looking ahead, we remain focused on long-term recovery efforts across the region. Ontario continues to support communities in need, and we are committed to ensuring we are prepared for future emergencies.

This storm has shown our collective strength and the importance of being prepared. Together, we will continue to overcome.

BRANCH ELECTIONS: WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW BEFORE YOU VOTE

In anticipation of the Branch election to be held on **Sunday May 4**, the following article is reprinted from the General By-laws for Branches of the Ontario Provincial Command of the Royal Canadian Legion, as amended to February 2022. Members are encouraged to consult up-to-date Legion By-laws and guidelines publications available on-line on the Provincial and Dominion Command websites. Some printed copies are also available from the Branch office.

ARTICLE IV - QUALIFICATION TO VOTE AND/OR HOLD OFFICE

401. Only Ordinary, Life, Associate, and Affiliate-Voting Members in good standing shall have the right to vote and hold Office in their Branch.

402. A voting Member, to be eligible for election to any Branch Office, must be in good standing for the year in which the election is held.

403. A voting Member will be required to have served at least one (1) term on the Branch Executive Committee to be eligible to be elected President or Vice-President.

404. (1) A voting Member will be required to have been a Member of the Branch for a period of one (1) year prior to the date of the election to be eligible for election to the Branch Executive Committee.

(2) Branch Regulations may require a voting Member to attend a minimum number or minimum percentage of General Meetings and the period of time during which the minimum attendance must have been attained prior to the date of the Election Meeting.

Note: Where a Branch enacts a Regulation for this purpose, it will be necessary that it keep an accurate record of attendance of all Members present at General Meetings.

405. (1) No Member who is a full time, regular part time or elect to work employee of any Branch or Command, or any organization thereof, who receives directly or indirectly any salary or wages for or on account of any service rendered to the Branch or Command or organization thereof, shall be eligible to hold any Executive position in the Branch. Any employee as defined in this section who is successful in their bid for office must resign their paid position before their Term of Office can commence.

(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, Members of the Ladies' Auxiliary employed by a Branch or Command may, at the discretion of the Branch or Command, hold Office in the Auxiliary.

406. No Member shall hold more than one elected Office in the Branch.

407. The Offices of Secretary and Treasurer shall not be held by the President or any of the Vice-Presidents.

408. The President shall not hold the position of Ladies' Auxiliary Liaison Officer.

409. The Term of Office shall be for one (1) year unless Branch Regulations make provision for a two (2) year term.

410. [NOT INCLUDED – Para 410 deals with subsequent appointments after the Elections]

REMEMBER:

You MUST have an <u>up-to-date</u> membership card with you in order to vote in the elections.



BRANCH HISTORIAN REPORT

Submitted by Comrade Norm Marion, Branch Historian Since my last report I sent in one submission and working on two more submissions to the Military Service Recognition Book (MSRB) Vol XII. New submissions or suggestions for submissions are welcome year round. A sample submission can be seen on this page featuring George Beaudoin, a Second World War veteran from Penetanguishene.



George Beaudpin served with the Royal 22e Régiment in Italy and the Central Mediterranean area until the end of the Second World War. He was branch members Tim and Wanda Beaudoin's grandfather.

BEAUDOIN, GEORGE JOHN

George John Beaudoin was born in Penetanguishene, Ontario, on March 9, 1910, the son of Alexandre and Exilda (Therrien) Beaudoin. Prior to the Second World War he worked in a stove foundry in Penetanguishene. In 1934 he married Harriet Eileen Taylor of the nearby village of Fesserton. George enrolled in the Canadian Army with the Grey & Simcoe Foresters in Toronto on April 17, 1941. Private (later Corporal) George Beaudoin, service number B-48886, sailed from Canada to arrive in the United Kingdom on September 19, 1943. He served overseas with the New Brunswick Rangers and later with the Royal 22e Régiment in the United Kingdom and in the Central Mediterranean Area until the end of the war. He earned the 1939-1945 Star, the France & Germany Star, the Italy Star, the Defence Medal, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with clasp, and the War Medal 1939-1945. George returned to Canada to be discharged on December 6, 1945. He returned to Penetanguishene where he lived for the rest of his life. He was a member of the local Legion Branch 68. George passed away on February 8, 1989. He is buried in St. Ann's Cemetery in Penetanguishene.


REMEMBERING VIMY RIDGE

The battle of Vimy Ridge is significant for Canada as for the first time, four Canadian army divisions (more than 100,000 men) fought side by side as a Canadian Corps, and came out victorious.

While Canadians suffered heavy casualties during the operation, they were successful in reaching and taking their heavily defended objectives on time, leaving the Allies in control of the high ground overlooking enemy positions. Together, the Canadian and British Corps had captured more ground, prisoners and artillery pieces than any previous British offensive of the war. But there was a cost to the battlefield victory. By the end of the battle, Canadians had suffered 10,600 casualties, 3,600 of them killed.

Two soldiers from Coldwater, Private Andrew Durnford and George Hill-Maracle, were killed in action during the battle, and four more were killed within a few weeks in the ensuing fighting over the Vimy area.

We will remember them.

\$42,000 OTF GRANT FROM THE ONTARIO GOVERNMENT GIVES COMMUNITY A LIFT


COLDWATER, ON – Today, April 19, 2025, Simcoe North MPP Jill Dunlop met with the team at Royal Canadian Legion Branch 270 Coldwater to hear more about the \$42,000 Capital Grant from the provincial government's Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF) that was used to replace aging windows and doors, purchase two new air/heat units, and purchase a water softener. The project will save on heat and hydro and will also make it more comfortable for the patrons who attend functions.

"The Coldwater Legion plays a vital role in supporting our veterans and strengthening our community," said Jill Dunlop, MPP for Simcoe North. "I am proud that through another OTF grant our government is helping ensure this important space remains safe, comfortable, and accessible for all. These upgrades will support year-round programming and bring long-term benefits to the many people who rely on the Legion as a hub for connection and support."

"We were able to replace two aging air units with more efficient heat/air units that will make it more comfortable for our members," said Kari Malmström, First Vice-President, Royal Canadian Legion Branch 270 Coldwater. "We also replaced several aging windows and doors that will be a significant savings for our heat and hydro." The Coldwater Branch No 270 of the Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League was founded on January 2, 1935, and the Branch's Ladies' Auxiliary followed on May 6, 1948. 
