

PUBLIC RELATIONS REPORT

Happy New Year everyone! To begin the new year, I would like to address some of the questions that were asked at previous General Meetings concerning the reporting on finances at the branch. Although some financial aspects of branch operations are not easy to summarize or simplify, the finances of Public Relations activities are fairly straight forward. So, the following is a rough outline of annual income and expenses that come under the PRO, based on the year 2018.

INCOME FROM ADVERTISING IN MAPLE LEAF: \$2,085. This number is the actual income from 45 ads (various rates) in the Maple Leaf from Jan to Dec 2018. A proposed increase in rates as of Jan 2019 would bring this up by approx. \$200. The number of ads is more or less static as six full pages out of 18 are presently dedicated to paid ads.

ANNUAL COST OF PRINTING MAPLE LEAF: **\$720**, based on \$60 monthly average for 50 B&W and 2 colour copies of 18-page issues.

ANNUAL COST OF WEB SITE: **\$180**. This includes the annual fee paid to WIX.COM (\$158) for hosting the www.coldwaterlegion.com site, and the annual fee for the rights to the domain "coldwaterlegion.com".


ANNUAL COST OF ADS IN TALK OF THE TOWN: **\$840**. This is the \$70 monthly fee to run a quarter-page ad "Happening at the Legion" that lists our main events/activities for the month. The monthly half-page allotted to Legion news is free.

PRINTING OF ANNUAL SCRAPBOOK X 2: **\$100**. This number is based on the cost of printing two copies of the 2017-2018 Scrapbook, which contained 89 pages.

IN SUMMARY: The income brought in by ads in the Maple Leaf is \$2,085. The total expenses related to PRO activities (excluding seminar/convention attendance) is approx. \$1,840. The \$245 surplus is expected to be spent on standup banner and/or promotional poster(s).




