COLDWATER BRANCH GETS ASSISTANCE FUNDING FROM FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

Members of the Executive of Royal Canadian Legion Branch 270, are pleased to announce that the Coldwater Legion has recently received the final portion of a grant that totaled more than \$15,000 from the federal government. The Veterans Organizations Emergency Support Fund grant received by the Legion will help in covering operational costs and financial shortfalls as a result of COVID-19 health restrictions.

Veterans' organizations, such as RCL Branch 270, are experiencing a critical loss of event, charitable and fundraising revenues as a direct result of COVID-19. They play a critical role in the lives and well-being of Veterans and their families, as well as providing extraordinary service to our communities. Legions host Remembrance Day observances and other commemorative events throughout the year, not only to honour fallen comrades, but also to educate Canadian youth about the past and the bravery of our soldiers. They are also community venues where marriages are celebrated, summer BBQs are enjoyed, and loved ones' lives are commemorated.

According to Simcoe North M.P. Bruce Stanton, "this special grant is greatly needed as in most cases; Legion branches do not qualify under any of the existing Covid-19



BUILDING OFFICER REPORT

Good day Comrades. First of all, I want to thank Garry Lovelace for his many years of service on the Executive. Garry was instrumental in getting two thirds of the roof done, having the safety ladder installed, and getting in touch with Shakell Heating and Cooling to get an estimate for the HVAC.

On May 18th I met with Don Shakell and Martin from BA Roofing. We talked about a joint venture to have the HVAC installed. We hope to start around the end of June. We were able to secure a grant for the purchase and installation of the HVAC.

"Working at Heights" restraint is applicable before the work on the roof can start. I hope to get the lumber for this project soon. I'll be reaching out for assistance with this, so, when I call, don't ignore me.

The top row of stone on the east side of the branch has to be re-mortared. I have a couple of stone masons coming to give us an estimate.

We have three estimates to have the carpet replaced on the stairs, in the elevator, and the landing upstairs in front of the banquet hall.

It's been a very hectic three weeks. Stay tuned.

AWARDING OF THE SOVEREIGN'S MEDAL FOR VOLUNTEERS

On Tuesday May 18, 2021, Member of Parliament for Simcoe North Bruce Stanton made a stop in Coldwater to make a virtual announcement about the latest round of

emergency funding for Legion branches. While in town, he also made a special presentation of a medal to a member of the Coldwater branch.

"It was my great honour to congratulate Coldwater Branch 270 President, Normand Marion on his much-deserved Sovereign Medal for Volunteer award," said M.P. Bruce Stanton, as he presented the medal on behalf of the Governor-General of Canada. *"Usually bestowed by the Governor-General of Canada, this is the highest award for lifelong volunteerism from the Canadian Chancellery of Honours."* he said.

The medal recognizes the exceptional volunteer achievements of Canadians from across the country in a wide range of fields and pays tribute to the dedication and commitment of volunteers.

The citation for Normand's award states: *"Normand Marion has contributed to the military community of Coldwater as a public relations manager, researcher, and fundraiser with various organizations, including the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 270 Coldwater. His investigations into First and Second World War casualties have shed light on the town's military history and helped memorialize those who served."*

"I feel very much humbled by this recognition," said Norm Marion, as he received the medal. *"I can think of so many others who have done so much more than I did, and who are more deserving of this award, but were never nominated. I'm certainly grateful to those who took the time to research and submit my nomination. Thank you."*

FOR MILITARY SERVICE RECOGNITION BOOK:

MEET MANLEY LYALL BRECHIN

Born in Coldwater, Ontario, on March 28, 1923, Manley Lyall Brechin was the son of John and Lila Brechin. After graduating from Orillia Collegiate Institute he worked as a junior clerk at a bank in Orillia. He was quite involved in sports, particularly hockey and basketball. During the Second World War he enrolled with the Royal Canadian Air Force on August 18, 1941. Leading Aircraftman Brechin

THIS MONTH WE REMEMBER

WOMEN IN CANADIAN MILITARY AVIATION

In 1974, six years before the job of Canadian Armed Forces pilot was opened to women, Major Wendy Clay, a doctor, completed military pilot training to better understand aeromedical issues. Then in 1979, three female captains undertook training to get their wings after the occupation was opened to women. For these three women, Captains Deanna Brasseur, Leah Mosher and Nora Bottomley, the runway to earning their wings was burdened with a heavy amount of attention and pressure because of their trailblazer status. Following these first three women, the Canadian Armed Forces would train and employ 40 total female pilots as part of its initial wave of training. Captain Brasseur, later major, along with Captain Jane Foster went on to become the first women to pilot a CF-18 Hornet jet fighter.

(RCAF service number J20439) completed his basic flying training at No.14 Elementary Flying Training School at Portage LaPrairie, Man. He was awarded his pilot wings upon graduation from No.11 Service Flying Training School in Yorkton, Sask., in July 1942, and was later given an officer commission. Flying Officer Brechin was eventually posted to No.458 Squadron (Royal Australian Air Force) in North Africa, operating in the Mediterranean along the coast of Italy. His last flight was on August 24, 1943, when he and his crew took off aboard their Vickers Wellington bomber for an anti-shipping reconnaissance mission over the Mediterranean, along the coast of Italy. The aircraft failed to return to base. Flying Officer Brechin has no known grave. He is commemorated on the Malta Memorial, in Malta.



ONTARIO COMMAND OPERATION LEAVE THE STREETS BEHIND HOMELESS VETERANS PROGRAM

The following is an overview of the Royal Canadian Legion, Ontario Command Homeless Veterans program, Operation Leave the Streets Behind.

The program was initiated in November 2009, by Ontario Command and the template created has since been developed across Canada, by Veterans Affairs and other Provincial Commands. The objective of course is to end Homelessness among our Veteran population. Through the generosity of our Legion Branches and Ladies Auxiliary, throughout the Province, money has been raised through various functions to support the Homeless Veterans program.

To date 2.7 million dollars has been disbursed from the Ontario Command Homeless Veterans Fund and over \$100,000.00 from our Ladies Auxiliary. There has been no financial support from any level of Government. More than 927 Homeless Veterans have been identified in 176 towns of which 93 are Female Veterans, since the beginning of the program. (Note: numbers given are as of May, 2021 and change monthly)

When a Homeless Veteran is identified we have the proper form completed (Request for Assistance and Release form) and once completed, it is sent to Veterans Affairs to verify the applicant has served in the Canadian Military. This form allows the Legion and VAC to access information to better understand their present situation. Once complete, the Legion will determine what the immediate needs of the Veteran are and take the appropriate action to meet those needs such as food, clothing or shelter.

We offer gift cards from Walmart, Tim Horton's or a local food store, to fulfill immediate needs and most can be

provided the same day or within 24 hours. We use our network of the 395 Legion Branches in Ontario to meet the needs. For example, from our office in Aurora we can reach out to a Legion branch in various communities to assist and provide the gift cards for food, or clothing thus meeting the immediate need of the Homeless Veteran.

The Royal Canadian Legion, Ontario Command has also partnered with George Brown College in Toronto, Algonquin College in Ottawa and St. Joseph's Health Care Centre in London creating Dental programs in the three locations for Homeless Veterans. All Dental work is paid for by Ontario Command.

The Homeless Veterans program has been a great success assisting more than 662 Homeless Veterans with rent payments and finding new apartments, providing dental work, clothing, and assisting with education requirements. A Veterans Hotline has been established (437-228-4747) to provide emergency service to our Veterans.
