LEGION SUPPORTS AWARDING VICTORIA CROSS TO AFGHANISTAN VETERAN

From the files of Dominion Command



OTTAWA, ON, 1 December 2021 – The Royal Canadian Legion is supporting efforts to award a Canadian soldier the Canadian Victoria Cross. It is the country's highest honour for bravery, valour, self-sacrifice and devotion to duty when in the presence of an enemy.

Private Jess Larochelle served in Afghanistan and performed selfless acts to save others during an attack by enemy

forces in 2006. Media reports describe a badly wounded and bleeding soldier who returned to his post to prevent further casualties as enemy fighters gained ground. While severely injured he fired multiple M72 rockets, resulting in the enemy's retreat and saving the rest of his section. Two members had already died.

"There is no doubt that Private Larochelle went above and beyond in excruciating circumstances to save his Comrades and serve our nation," says Bruce Julian, Dominion President. "We ask that our military leaders review Private Larochelle's actions with a view to honouring him with this award."

The Legion joins a chorus of others requesting Pte. Larochelle be recognized for his extraordinary service with the Canadian Victoria Cross. He was previously awarded the Star of Military Valour, which is the second highest award for bravery.

The Victoria Cross was established in 1856 and has been awarded to over 80 Canadians. The Canadian Victoria Cross was established on 1 January 1993 and has not been awarded to any soldiers to date.



THIS MONTH WE REMEMBER

COLONEL JOHN MCRAE

On January 28, 1918, Lieutenant-Colonel John McRae, author of the poem "In Flanders Fields", dies of pneumonia near Boulogne, France. McCrae, a doctor and teacher, served in both the South African War and the First World War. In August of 1914 he joined the first contingent of the Canadian Expeditionary Force. He was appointed a medical officer with the First Brigade of the Canadian Field Artillery with the rank of Major and second-in-command. "In Flanders Fields" was first published in England's Punch magazine in December 1915. Within months, this poem came to symbolize the sacrifices of all who were fighting in the First World War. Today, the poem continues to be a part of Remembrance Day ceremonies in Canada and other countries throughout the world.



STATEMENT FROM THE MINISTER OF NATIONAL DEFENCE, THE CHIEF OF THE DEFENCE STAFF, AND THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF NATIONAL DEFENCE

The Minister of National Defence, the Honourable Anita Anand, the Chief of the Defence Staff, General Wayne Eyre, and the Deputy Minister, Jody Thomas, issued the following statement:

"There must be absolutely no place in our organization for sexual assault, sexual harassment or discrimination based on sex, gender, gender identity or sexual orientation. We know that our collective failure to build an inclusive workplace culture free from these unacceptable behaviours has hurt our people.

"As part of our efforts to restore relationships with those harmed, we will offer a public apology to all current and former members of the Defence Team who have been affected by sexual assault and sexual misconduct, including harassment, and discrimination."

The Honourable Anita Anand, Minister of National Defence, will offer an apology on behalf of the Government of Canada. General Wayne Eyre, Chief of the Defence Staff, will offer an apology on behalf of the Canadian Armed Forces. Jody Thomas, Deputy Minister of National Defence, will offer an apology on behalf of the Department of National Defence.

The apology will take place virtually at 1 p.m. EST on December 13 and will be livestreamed on the <u>Canadian Armed Forces Facebook page</u>. Viewers can watch the video stream without an account or signing in to Facebook. A link to the video will be posted shortly before the event on the CAF and DND Facebook and Twitter pages, and will also be available on the <u>DND/CAF Sexual Misconduct Apology web page</u>. The event will also be recorded and available afterwards on <u>YouTube</u> for those who are unable to watch it live or prefer to view it at a later time.

Everyone will process the apology in their own way. The apology may evoke strong emotional responses and/or cause trauma to resurface – either in the moment or later on. Should you or someone you know require support, a list of available support services can be found here. If you, or someone you know has experienced an incident

If you, or someone you know has experienced an incident of sexual misconduct, there is help available. Here are the services available to <u>Defence Team members</u>.

"All Defence Team members should be treated fairly in a workplace that is safe and free of any kind of harassment and discrimination. We know there is much more work to do to create lasting and positive culture change, and we will continue to listen to and learn from those affected to ensure we are taking the necessary action to make that change."
