

The Building Account balance is \$3,005.26.


The Nevada Account balance remains \$237.61

Veterans Affairs Canada has made progress in processing disability claims submitted by Veterans.

In February 2021, VAC announced the hiring of 90 personnel to assist in addressing the growing number of claims and reduce the current backlog of 40,000+ already submitted claims.

In February of 2022, VAC announced the extension of employment to personnel hired in 2021 to address the backlog. This is excellent news and should alleviate some of the frustration Veterans are experiencing.

Mental health issues amongst Veterans continue to grow at an alarming rate, and claim submissions to VAC mirror that. Events such as Bell Let's talk and other programs avail through VAC and the Legion are helping to reduce the stigmas associated with mental illness. More and more Veterans are coming forward and sharing their stories.

Despite the pandemic of the past two years, this chair has continued to provide assistance to Veterans and their families in our area, whether by mail, phone or a visit. I must say it has had its challenges. The pandemic has brought to the forefront the continued need for Veterans in such areas as mental illness, homelessness, loneliness and isolation, accessibility and other issues such as food insecurity, income, or accessibility to dental or medical services and transportation. These issues were not necessarily on the front burner in the past - i.e. a Veteran with no family doctor who needs a referral to a specialist and can't get one. Also evident was just how vulnerable our health care system is and who is at risk, including our Veterans. In short things are improving, however there is a great distance to go for our Veterans to achieve the status they deserve.



THIS MONTH WE REMEMBER

TOMMY PRINCE

On April 24, 1945, indigenous war hero Tommy Prince received the U.S. Silver Star Medal for leading a two-man reconnaissance mission deep behind enemy lines. Having located gun sites and encampment area of an enemy reserve battalion. Prince walked 70 kilometres across the rugged, mountainous terrain to report the information and led the brigade to the encampment. He then joined in the battle. When the fighting in Southern France was over, Prince was summoned to Buckingham Palace, where King George VI decorated him with both the Military Medal and, on behalf of the president of the United States, the Silver Star with ribbon. Tommy Prince was one of 59 Canadians who were awarded the Silver Star during the Second World War. Only three of this group also possessed the Military Medal. Source: Veterans Affairs Canada

CHARLES LESLIE ARCHER

Born in Tay Township, Ontario, on December 28, 1916, Charles Leslie Archer was the son of John "Clinton" and Myrtle Susan (Durnford) Archer. Charles had a twin brother, John Tholby, who would also serve in the Army. Before he enlisted, Charles married Margaret Silk of North River near Coldwater, Ontario. During the Second World War, he enrolled in the Canadian Army in Prince George, B.C., on March 3, 1943. Private Archer (Service number B-127935) first joined the Prince of Wales Rangers, and later transferred to the Lincoln and Welland Regiment. He served in the United Kingdom and Continental Europe. Charles' unit landed in France on July 25, 1944, and continued to fight in North-West Europe until the end of the war. Promoted to the rank of Corporal, Charles was wounded in action in February 1945, getting hit by bomb fragments in his arm. Deemed unable to meet military physical standards, he was discharged from the Army on September 25, 1945. Charles was a member of Royal Canadian Legion Branch 270 Coldwater. He passed away on August 2, 1977, at age 60. He is buried at St. John's Anglican Cemetery, Severn Township, near Coldwater.

BRANCH ELECTIONS: WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW BEFORE YOU VOTE

In anticipation of the Branch election to be held on May 1st, the following article is reprinted from the *General By-laws* for Branches of the Ontario Provincial Command of the Royal Canadian Legion, as amended to February 2022. Members are encouraged to consult up-to-date Legion Bylaws and guidelines publications available on-line on the Provincial and Dominion Command websites. Some printed copies are also available from the Branch office.

ARTICLE IV - QUALIFICATION TO VOTE AND/OR HOLD OFFICE

- 401. Only Ordinary, Life, Associate, and Affiliate-Voting Members in good standing shall have the right to vote and hold Office in their Branch.
- 402. A voting Member, to be eligible for election to any Branch Office, must be in good standing for the year in which the election is held.
- 403. A voting Member will be required to have served at least one (1) term on the Branch Executive Committee to be eligible to be elected President or Vice-President.
- 404. (1) A voting Member will be required to have been a Member of the Branch for a period of one (1) year

- prior to the date of the election to be eligible for election to the Branch Executive Committee.
- (2) Branch Regulations may require a voting Member to attend a minimum number or minimum percentage of General Meetings and the period of time during which the minimum attendance must have been attained prior to the date of the Election Meeting.
- Note: Where a Branch enacts a Regulation for this purpose, it will be necessary that it keep an accurate record of attendance of all Members present at General Meetings.
- 405. (1) No Member who is a full time, regular part time or elect to work employee of any Branch or Command, or any organization thereof, who receives directly or indirectly any salary or wages for or on account of any service rendered to the Branch or Command or organization thereof, shall be eligible to hold any Executive position in the Branch. Any employee as defined in this section who is successful in their bid for office must resign their paid position before their Term of Office can commence.
 - (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, Members of the Ladies' Auxiliary employed by a Branch or Command may, at the discretion of the Branch or Command, hold Office in the Auxiliary.
- 406. No Member shall hold more than one elected Office in the Branch.
- 407. The Offices of Secretary and Treasurer shall not be held by the President or any of the Vice-Presidents.
- 408. The President shall not hold the position of Ladies' Auxiliary Liaison Officer.
- 409. The Term of Office shall be for one (1) year unless Branch Regulations make provision for a two (2) year term.
- 410. [NOT INCLUDED Para 410 deals with subsequent appointments after the Elections]

THE VETERANS' WIVES SUPPORT GROUP TO RUN AT LEGION BRANCH 110 IN TRENTON

Mar 28, 2022 - The Royal Canadian Legion Branch 110 in Trenton, Ontario happily received a five-year grant from the <u>Veteran and Family Well-being Fund</u> for its Veterans' Wives Support Group.

The group provides support and coaching to female Veterans, wives of Veterans and women caring for Veterans. Securing funding was a major goal for Branch 110—especially for office manager and grant-writer Debbie Holmes, who spends a great deal of time ensuring the branch's programs for Veterans come to fruition.

"We are always listening to what our Legion members, our Veterans and our community needs," says Holmes. "Here at our branch, we have many wives of Veterans who volunteer in various positions in the Legion. While working with them, I've heard them convey the stories of how they have had to live without their husbands, raising children alone, and all the other pressures of being a military wife." She said she also hears of the challenges women face while caring for an ageing Veteran and spouses who have both served, which comes with special challenges from that lifestyle.

Spending time with these women gave Holmes the idea for the Veterans' Wives Support Group.

The Legion branch trialed the support group a few years ago, with the assistance of a one-year grant from the Bell True Patriot Love Fund. The project was an enormous success, and since then, Holmes has been searching for funding for it to continue.

Finally, a grant from the Veteran Family Well-Being Fund was secured—The program will begin in the spring and will continue for the next five years.

The Veterans' Wives Support Group is run by registered psychotherapist Denise MacDonald. The group meets twice a month and works on therapeutic support for their unique challenges, such as caring for an ageing Veteran. The group holds a safe space for these women to share and support one another.

"The psychotherapist we hired for this program works with many people, including Veterans with PTSD, and has a farm that offers equine therapy. She is simply amazing," says Holmes. "I can't wait for the program to begin again. These women are the unsung heroes of the military and deserve all the support we can give them."

LEGION OPPOSES PLAN TO DISTURB SACRED GROUNDS IN FRANCE

28 March 2022 – The Royal Canadian Legion is aghast over plans to build a new housing development on the hallowed grounds of the D-Day landings of 1944. In a heartfelt appeal, Dominion President Bruce Julian issued the following sentiments.


"The grounds at Juno Beach in France are sacred and revered. They are where Canadian and allied soldiers fought and died during the Second World War, and people from near and far visit this tranquil setting to pay respects. Disturbing the surroundings permanently with a housing complex would negatively affect the area in irreversible ways. This was the site of a pivotal world conflict — which led to our freedoms today. We implore those involved in this project to consider the physical and emotional damage it would create and choose an appropriate alternate location."

A French developer is currently working on plans to build a 70-unit housing complex. Concerned citizens in both Canada and France are also hoping to reverse this decision.


