

### BUILDING MANAGER REPORT

*Submitted by Comrade Kari Malmstrom, Building Manager*  
I have the following report in the way of maintenance or building issues since our last meeting.

Status of repairs and building in general are as follows.

Repairs and work being looked at or completed:

- Monthly extinguisher / exit light review completed.
- I met with Jake from Severn Fire Department for the annual inspection. Only two items needed to be completed and I have forwarded Jake the needed information. This included modifying the floor plan to show the fire monitor location and a copy of our annual inspection by Huronia Alarms. All have been completed.
- I was notified by Marlene about the canteen faucet and stove not working. I replaced the faucet seal but it still leaks. I suggest we purchase a new faucet for the canteen and upstairs kitchen to be installed by a plumber as mounts are commercial. I took apart the canteen stove elements, cleaned them, and tested to see if they worked better. We do need a new ignitor for center element but maybe a new commercial stove is needed as the unit is getting worn out.
- We're having issues with the beer cooler refrigeration unit. I will contact the company to come and advise as to what is needed to repair. The compressor no longer

functions. Cockburn Refrigeration Ltd. is looking into lead time for a new compressor. It was also suggested that the beer fridge be wired on a separate circuit breaker.

- Still no word on A/C repair except that parts are hard to come by and maybe a new unit is needed. Shakell is to forward a proposal on cost of repair or replacement for our review.
- Still waiting for roof inspection to determine location of leak or leaks. I want to thank Earl Brandon for the donation of the sound system for upstairs. I understand it works well and should be better for meetings.



## LEGION'S 2023 NATIONAL POPPY CAMPAIGN LAUNCHES

*Fifty new "Poppy Stories" and donation modernization highlight the campaign*

Ottawa, ON, 23 October 2023 – Volunteers across the country are ramping up for The Royal Canadian Legion's 2023 National Poppy Campaign, set for launch on Friday, October 27.

*"The National Poppy Campaign is instrumental to our work," says Bruce Julian, Dominion President. "Funds raised allow us to support our Veterans, their families, and communities. Our focus on Remembrance during this time is also an important part of our mission to never forget Canada's fallen."*

### Boxes, Biodegradable Poppies and Wreaths

Traditional Poppy boxes will be available at thousands of locations across the country for cash donations and lapel Poppy distribution. The Legion's modern "Pay Tribute" tap-enabled donation poppy boxes will once again be featured and donors will also be able to give online through the Legion's national website.

Expect to see more biodegradable Poppies and wreaths, crafted from a variety of natural materials including paper, cotton velvet, plaster, moss, and bamboo. ### Poppy Stories: Connecting with fallen Veterans

A large part of the Poppy Campaign and Remembrance period is about paying respects to our fallen Veterans. The Legion is proud to present the next iteration of "Poppy Stories." Through this initiative, people can scan a lapel Poppy with a smartphone at [poppystories.ca](http://poppystories.ca) and be taken to meaningful short stories about everyday Canadians who dedicated their lives to serving our country. This year, which marks the 75th anniversary of the first United Nations peacekeeping mission, the focus will be on an additional 50 new Poppy Stories, highlighting the lives of Veterans who took part in peacekeeping assignments.

The first UN peacekeeping mission was established in May 1948, when the UN Security Council authorized the deployment of a small number of UN military observers to monitor the Armistice Agreement between Israel and its Arab neighbours. Canada has a long history of serving in support of peace efforts around the world. Canadians have deployed overseas to participate in UN, NATO and other multinational peace operations. Peacekeepers are neutral international troops who are sent to countries in turmoil to help reduce tensions and restore peace. They play vital roles including monitoring ceasefires, patrolling buffer zones, clearing landmines, investigating war crimes, helping refugees and providing humanitarian aid. More than 125,000 CAF members have served in international peacekeeping efforts in dozens of countries over the decades. Approximately 130 of them have lost their lives and many more have returned home with physical and psychological wounds.




