Stay safe Coldwater! In fact, stay home unless you have something to do that is deemed "essential." We, at the Coldwater Legion, are taking this COVID-19 virus emergency very seriously. Members of the Executive were quick to take measured and timely action in the early days of the crisis, and continue to monitor the situation and run Legion affairs from home through phone and email. On Tuesday March 17, Royal Canadian Legion Branch 270 Coldwater closed its doors until further notice in response to the pandemic. Although this has caused inconveniences to many, our primary concern remains the health and safety of our members, patrons, and the surrounding community. All events, meetings, and activities that were scheduled to take place at this branch location in the next month are cancelled or postponed. Hopefully, our regularly scheduled activities will resume soon once the crisis is over. These measures are consistent with recommendations from Health Canada and the Ontario Chief Medical Officer. They will be reviewed periodically as the situation evolves.

Note that *The 270 Bistro* remains open for take-out orders through the take-out window. Orders may be placed by calling or texting (705) 955-2704, open week days for lunch 11:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., and dinner from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m.

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Comrades,

I hope this issue of *The Maple Leaf* finds you safe, healthy, and in relatively good spirit given the circumstances. This mass confinement is certainly annoying, but considering the alternative if we don't do it, it's not that bad of a thing after all. In some ways it reminds me of my Army days when we got Confined to Barracks (CB) for having broken some obscure Army rule, but minus the rifle, uniform, and equipment cleaning, washroom scrubbing, and floor buffing. And without the reporting in for inspection every few hours. And without the drill. But with Netflix, satellite TV, DVDs, iPhones, and the Internet. OK, not a great comparison. We'll be just fine. As mentioned in the front page article, members of your Executive have, and will continue to take appropriate action during this emergency. We will continue to run Legion affairs from home through phone and email. We already held several "e-meetings" to vote on implementing measures and keep the branch going. Matters that are not urgent will wait until General Meetings resume. Keep in mind that, even though the branch doors are locked, our branch phone messages at (705) 686-3388 and branch email branch270@rogers.com are monitored daily.

In the past week or so, members of our Executive have been calling our members to make sure everyone is OK, and to offer assistance if required. Thank you Comrades Wayne Tutt, Carol Baird, Betty-Jean Murray, Betty-Anne Burnie, and Randy Rice. I also contacted our Township of Severn Mayor Mike Burkett and Deputy-Mayor Jane Dunlop to offer assistance from our pool of Legion volunteers for if/when required.

At this point all branch events and in-house activities are cancelled or postponed until further notice. The one exception is the Seniors Literary Competition, which has been modified to accept submissions by email only, and was given an extended deadline for submissions until June 15 (see page 6-7). After considerations it was agreed that the competition would be particularly beneficial to some of our seniors who are confined at home, while it could be run in a completely safe manner. So get writing, seniors!

Our branch elections, which would normally take place on the first Sunday in May, may be postponed depending on how the pandemic situation evolves. Dominion Command has amended the General By-Laws to allow provincial commands to postpone elections if required. More to come on this.

In terms of conventions, the District "E" Spring Convention, which was scheduled to take place at the Lisle and Everett



branches early this month, has been postponed (tentatively) to June 5-7. The Dominion Convention in Saskatoon scheduled for August 22-27 is still on, at least for now.

Finally, I want to remind everyone that the best way to avoid catching and spreading the COVID-19 virus is to wash your hands frequently with soap, and practise social distancing by staying home whenever possible. Stay home! Stay safe!

THIS MONTH WE REMEMBER

Vimy Ridge

The Battle of Vimy Ridge began on Easter Monday, April 9, 1917, when the first wave of 15,000-20,000 Canadian soldiers attacked through the wind-driven snow and sleet into the face of deadly machine gun fire. The battle proved to be a great success, but it came at a heavy cost. The some 100,000 Canadians who served there suffered more than 10,600 casualties, nearly 3,600 of which were fatal. At Vimy Ridge, regiments from coast to coast saw action together in a distinctly Canadian triumph, helping create a new and stronger sense of national identity in our country. Canada's military achievements during the war raised our international stature and helped earn us a separate signature on the Treaty of Versailles that formally ended the war.

LEGION INITIATIVES GOING STRONG IN THE MIDST OF THE PANDEMIC

The Royal Canadian Legion and its volunteer members are challenging COVID-19! With a little ingenuity and in the spirit of supporting our Veterans and communities, amazing work is happening in many parts of the country – members have found ways to continue helping while respecting advice from medical officials.

One example is Buddy Check Coffee, launched nationally just recently. The program gives Veterans a chance to meet for coffee in a supportive setting, to socialize. With the new restrictions in place across the country, some locations have moved their meetings online.

"Given social distancing and isolation, we knew that connecting would be more important than ever and started work on finding a solution, thus Virtual Buddy Check Coffee was born," says Chris Richardson, co-founder of Buddy Check Coffee. "So far, it's been fantastic, we get to talk about what's happening, how we are doing, stories from service. Some folks drop by for a few minutes and others hang out for an entire hour. We have been able to connect, share concerns and also lighten the day."

Richardson says the sessions have also given participants an opportunity to share ideas about how best to help their local communities during the COVID-19 situation.

As another way to stay connected, the Woodbine Heights Branch in Toronto, Ontario is hosting live music parties at what has become their "virtual" branch. Their president is inviting friends and members to host similar parties and play music, sing songs or tell stories.

"We'll get through this together at a social distance - and can all have some virtual fun together!" says Brenda Heath.





INTRODUCING VETERAN MICHAEL O'HARA

Comrade Michael has always had strong military role models. His grandfather was in the Infantry and served in the Great War. His father was in the Air Force and served in the Second World War. Brother John is a former Air Force Reservist (*see M.L. issue, April 2019*).

Comrade Michael wished to pursue a career in Aeronautical Engineering. In 1972 he applied to Royal Roads Military College (outside of the Esquimalt Military Base) near Victoria, British Columbia. At this time in our recent history, the College was attended only by male recruits. Female recruits were invited to attend two-three years later. The plan was to attend and get his education. Comrade Michael stated that albeit the accommodations and menu options were great, he found the requirements of a regimented daily life too confining.

After his first year, he had to make a decision to stay at the College or leave before boot camp. To stay would mean another eight years of military life. To leave mid-stream would necessitate the paying-back to the government what they had invested in his education, room and board. In June 1973, at age twenty-one Comrade Michael chose to leave the College but he took with him the new and added appreciation of discipline, and his continued interest in higher education. Further, Comrade Michael shared that albeit brief, the Military College experience has impacted his life in that he continues to question and learn from his experiences.

For a short period of time, Comrade Michael worked in the lumber industry as well as in irrigation. He never lost sight of his passion for a better education. He enrolled at the University of British Columbia and in 1982 he graduated with his degree as a Civil Engineer.

Early in the 1980's, the province of British Columbia was in somewhat of an economic turmoil and in 1985, Comrade Michael packed up his family and they drove to Ontario. From 1985 to current date, he has been employed by the same Orangeville organization.

Originally a member of Branch 68 in Penetanguishene, Comrade Michael transferred to our Branch as it is closer to his home and this allows him to participate in a variety of activities. In June 2018 Comrade Michael suffered an All-Terrain Vehicle accident.

During the interview process, he mentioned that our Branch has been most accommodating and he is amazed at the accessibility of our numerous activities. At the interview, Comrade Michael was asked, "What one thing would you change at our Branch?" His reply, "Not a thing. We have a great group of volunteers and things are running smoothly."

In closing, Comrade Michael shared that the interview process was not too personal, nor too lengthy. It was good.






