INTRODUCING OUR COMRADE CARL SWANSON

At the age of fifteen Comrade Carl knew he wanted to serve our country but a health issue prevented any military engagement. He pursued a career as a Certified Auto Mechanic with a passion for hot rods and drag racing. He was at the right place, at the right time when an investigating Ontario Provincial Police officer came into the Garage looking for 'help with a case' and suggested Carl's knowledge of car mechanics would be an asset in his pursuit to be of service to his country.

Fast forward past auto salvage jobs, garage ownership and offering his expertise in auto parts identification cases, Comrade Carl realized that his dream of serving his country was an application away. He proudly remembers his acceptance to serve with the Ontario Provincial Police.

After completing mandatory training which included report writing, health, firearms, law enforcement, the study of the Criminal Code plus other specialized training, Comrade Carl was posted to Oakville and then to Burlington and Waterdown followed by two years with highway patrol duties. His background as a licensed auto mechanic led to his appointment with Headquarters in the Special Investigative Branch, Auto Theft.

In twenty-eight years (15 years in auto theft), Detective Constable Carl served at the General Headquarters in Toronto. Shortly after transferring to the new Orillia General Headquarters, Comrade Carl and his wife chose to take advantage of the '80 points' early retirement package. Recipient of the Good Conduct Medal, he continued to provide his auto mechanic services to the Toronto Auto

At breakfast time, every Thursday morning Comrade Carl shares his time and thoughts with past colleagues who reminisce that "Times are changing, and we're changing with them." He shared "to attract the younger person, our organization needs to change; perhaps reduce the number of Branches in an area. The Veterans' Dinner and the Poppy Drive is what the Legion is all about. Our involvement with the schools is secondary." Comrade Carl closed the interview with his statement, "I am surprised at the depth of the interview - it is more than what was expected".


