TREASURER REPORT

Submitted by Comrade Rick Morse, Secretary-Treasurer As of March 27, 2023, the General Account balance is \$53,613.87.

In the General Account, we have restricted funds of \$25,228.11 for Grants and \$1,000 for the Cenotaph's Second World War Coldwater Veterans project. Note that the Grants fund will soon be zeroed out once the invoice for the bathroom renovations is paid.

With funds committed to the Grant, and the Cenotaph projects equaling \$26,228.11, we have a daily operational amount of \$27,385.76.

The Bottle Drive deposits for the month of February totaled \$824.40.

The Bottle Drive deposits for the month of March to date total \$1,243.60.

Building Bank Account balance is \$12,081.72.

Nevada Account balance remains at \$237.61

I informed the Executive at the Executive Meeting of March 8, 2023, that after thinking long and hard over the last six months, I have made the decision that at the end of this Executive's Term of Service, I will not be continuing in any capacity within the Branch and will be stepping away. SERVICE OFFICER REPORT

On March 7, Comrade Norm Marion and I attended a meeting at the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) Central Region Headquarters in Orillia, along with Sherry Culling,

the Provincial Service Officer, OPP Officers and Legion representatives from the local area.

The three OPP Officers in attendance were Veterans having served and still serving as Reservists in the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF). The purpose of the meeting was to educate and bring awareness to the OPP in Orillia of the resources available to Veterans through the Royal Canadian Legion and Veterans Affairs Canada.

The OPP in Orillia has started a program whereby, upon contact with Veterans while on duty, OPP officers would be able to direct the Veteran to Legion assistance, i.e. homeless Veterans or any requiring emergency assistance. Many experiences were shared and issues discussed suggesting that a database be generated with contact info for area Legions. It was also emphasized that the first point of contact would be the Provincial Service officer who would in turn contact the Veterans Service Officer at the local branch, if required.

The OPP officers stated they were not aware of the extensive services provided by the Legion. They also stated there is a growing number of new OPP Officers with military background having served in the CAF and the OPP now has a policy in place allowing Officers to also serve as Reservists in the CAF as a secondary occupation.

Overall there was an excellent exchange of ideas and suggestions in moving forward. It was also suggested to arrange further sessions and to include additional detachments of the OPP.

THE ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION RESPONDS: 2023 FEDERAL BUDGET

Positive investment made but details unknown

OTTAWA, 28 March 2023 – The Royal Canadian Legion is trusting that the 2023 budget commitment of \$156.7 million dollars announced today to help support military and RCMP Veterans, will do just that – and in tangible ways.

"We are happy to see this proposed spending," says Bruce Julian, Dominion President. "But it needs to be properly targeted. We would like more clarity on exactly how it will be spent. This funding should go where it's needed most, and in a way that directly benefits Veterans and clears the backlog."

The proposed investment in Veterans Affairs Canada, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and the Veterans Review and Appeal Board over five years was announced in the budget to help tackle the backlog in benefits processing, and support the delivery of programs and services.

"The Legion would also like assurances that this money will actually be spent," says Julian. Earlier this year, it was reported that Veterans Affairs Canada had not spent one billion dollars during its previous fiscal year. The question still remains, will those particular funds eventually become reallocated? At the time, it was reported this funding would "remain available" in future years.

Notably, the new \$156.7 million commitment is only a small percentage of those unspent funds.

The Legion will continue to monitor the details and any plan of action related to the Budget 2023 investment.

THIS MONTH WE REMEMBER

VIMY RIDGE

The Battle of Vimy Ridge saw, for the first time, four Canadian army divisions (more than 100,000 men) fought side by side as a Canadian Corps. The battle began on Easter Monday, April 9, 1917. After months of intelligence gathering, planning, and rehearsing, a first wave of more than 15,000 Canadian soldiers attacked German defenses, forcing their way through mud, defensive obstacles and deadly machine gun fire. In spite of inclement weather, the extensive preparation and innovative tactics soon gave the Canadians the advantage. Advancing behind a precisely timed "creeping" artillery barrage, Canadian soldiers were able to capture German positions at the critical moment before the enemy could emerge from their bunkers to counter-attack. But there was a cost to the battlefield victory. By the end of the battle, Canadians had suffered 10,600 casualties, 3,600 of them killed.

BRANCH HISTORIAN REPORT

I'm working on another one for Edward Godfrey, a First World War soldier from Coldwater. A nice framed photo of him was just donated to our collection by a relative.

If you know someone who served in the military who you think could be featured in a future MSRB, please contact me. You can see on this page an example of an MSRB submission featuring John 'Jack' Smith who was killed in action during the Second World War. Jack was the father of Legion member Tom Smith.

SMITH, JOHN "JACK" WEAKFORD

Born in Honey Harbour, Ontario, on April 26, 1913, John Weakford Smith was the son of Franklin Fowler and Margaret Elizabeth (Weakford) Smith of Honey Harbour. Before he enlisted in the Army, "Jack", as he was known, worked as a pipe mechanic. He married Florence Blanche Moreau, of Victoria Harbour, Ontario, in March 1942, and together they had a son, Thomas ("Tom"). During the Second World War, Jack enrolled with the Canadian Army in Toronto on July 18, 1942. Private Jack Smith (Service number B-130212) initially joined the Royal Canadian Engineers, but soon transferred to the Algonquin Regiment, part of the Canadian Infantry Corps. After his basic infantry training and some Home Defence service in Canada, he embarked with his unit for the United Kingdom on June 11, 1943, and served with the regiment in the United Kingdom and through the advance in Normandy, France. Lance-Corporal Jack Smith was killed in action against the enemy on August 10, 1944, during the latter part of Allied operations in Normandy. He was 31 years of age. He is buried in the Bretteville-sur-Laize Canadian War Cemetery in Normandy.



BRANCH ELECTIONS: WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW BEFORE YOU VOTE

In anticipation of the Branch election to be held on Sunday May 7, the following article is reprinted from the General By-laws for Branches of the Ontario Provincial Command of the Royal Canadian Legion, as amended to February 2022. Members are encouraged to consult up-to-date Legion By-laws and guidelines publications available on-line on the Provincial and Dominion Command websites. Some printed copies are also available from the Branch office.

ARTICLE IV - QUALIFICATION TO VOTE AND/OR HOLD OFFICE

- 401. Only Ordinary, Life, Associate, and Affiliate-Voting Members in good standing shall have the right to vote and hold Office in their Branch.
- 402. A voting Member, to be eligible for election to any Branch Office, must be in good standing for the year in which the election is held.
- 403. A voting Member will be required to have served at least one (1) term on the Branch Executive Committee to be eligible to be elected President or Vice-President.
- 404. (1) A voting Member will be required to have been a Member of the Branch for a period of one (1) year prior to the date of the election to be eligible for election to the Branch Executive Committee.
- (2) Branch Regulations may require a voting Member to attend a minimum number or minimum percentage of General Meetings and the period of time during which the

minimum attendance must have been attained prior to the date of the Election Meeting.

Note: Where a Branch enacts a Regulation for this purpose, it will be necessary that it keep an accurate record of attendance of all Members present at General Meetings.

- 405. (1) No Member who is a full time, regular part time or elect to work employee of any Branch or Command, or any organization thereof, who receives directly or indirectly any salary or wages for or on account of any service rendered to the Branch or Command or organization thereof, shall be eligible to hold any Executive position in the Branch. Any employee as defined in this section who is successful in their bid for office must resign their paid position before their Term of Office can commence.
- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, Members of the Ladies' Auxiliary employed by a Branch or Command may, at the discretion of the Branch or Command, hold Office in the Auxiliary.

406. No Member shall hold more than one elected Office in the Branch.

- 407. The Offices of Secretary and Treasurer shall not be held by the President or any of the Vice-Presidents.
- 408. The President shall not hold the position of Ladies' Auxiliary Liaison Officer.
- 409. The Term of Office shall be for one (1) year unless Branch Regulations make provision for a two (2) year term.


