In early April, delegates from the Coldwater Branch attended the annual District "E" Spring Convention at the Aurora Branch in Newmarket. In addition to the senior officers and committee Chairperson's reports and other regular Legion business, one of the high points of the convention was to hear the District Commander read aloud, to the 130 delegates at the convention, the citation for this year's District Legionnaire of the Year, which turned out to be OUR OWN BRANCH PRESIDENT, Betty-Jean Murray! It was a great moment for her, and for the branch! The citation for the award speaks for itself:

"Comrade Betty-Jean Murray displayed exemplary dedication to the wellbeing and the advancement of the Coldwater Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion. In addition to her regular committee duties, Comrade Murray served as a member of a Command directed Board of Management (BOM) that oversaw the activities of the branch for a year. As one of two members of the branch on the BOM, she often took on duties that would normally have been done by the President or one of the Vice-Presidents, including the coordination or hosting of branch events such as the Vimy Luncheon and Veterans Appreciation Dinner. She eagerly represented Branch 270 at several events outside the

VIMY DAY: On Tuesday April 9, I attended the Vimy Day Breakfast in Borden with the Branch President. The event included an early morning Remembrance ceremony at the restored First World War trenches on base, and several presentations from dignitaries. This is an annual event to which Legion members are invited. On our return to the branch, Comrade Wayne Tutt and Betty-Jean placed a wreath at the Cenotaph in remembrance of Vimy Ridge. Our flags were half-masted for the day. According to many historians, the 1917 battle of Vimy Ridge unified the country by giving it a new sense of a national identity. It was a battle in which, for the first time, four Canadian army divisions (more than 100,000 men) fought side by side as a Canadian Corps, and came out victorious.

FIRST WORLD WAR KILLED IN ACTION: Mini biographies (under 140 words) for 21 of the 24 Coldwater soldiers killed

in action during the First World War were edited and submitted for inclusion in the next volume of the Military Service Recognition Book (MSRB). The three others had been submitted earlier. Hopefully, all will appear in MSRB Volume VI later this year. The full versions of all 24 bios have been posted together in the "About Us" section of the branch website, under the heading "Roll of Honour."

CENOTAPH AREA LANDSCAPING: Plans for the upgrading of the landscaping around the Cenotaph area are progressing. Meetings involving the BIA, the Library and the branch have already taken place. The most obvious changes will be the removal of the chain fence and the lilacs separating the library side from the Legion's (both already done), and the addition of boulders and flower beds. We will also extend the brick path to the edge of the parking area. Comrade Wayne Tutt has volunteered to coordinate the project.

More than 4,600 courageous service men and women lost their lives at sea. In Canada the Battle of the Atlantic is commemorated every year on the first Sunday in May. WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW BEFORE YOU VOTE

In anticipation of the Branch election to be held on May 22, the following article is reprinted from the *General By-laws for Branches of the Ontario Provincial Command of the Royal Canadian Legion*, as amended to December 2018. Members are encouraged to consult up-to-date Legion By-laws and guidelines publications available on-line on the Provincial and Dominion Command websites. Some printed copies are also available from the Branch office.

ARTICLE IV - QUALIFICATION TO VOTE AND/OR HOLD OFFICE

- 401. Only Ordinary, Associate and Affiliate-Voting Members, in good standing, shall have the right to vote or hold office.
- 402. A voting Member, to be eligible for election to any Branch Office, must be in good standing for the year in which the election is held.
- 403. A voting Member will be required to have served at least one (1) term on the Branch Executive Committee to be eligible to be elected President or Vice-President.
- 404. (1) A voting Member will be required to have been a Member of the Branch for a period of one (1) year prior to the date of the election to be

eligible for election to the Branch Executive Committee.

(2) Branch Regulations may require a voting Member to attend a minimum number of or minimum percentage of General Meetings and the period of time during which the minimum attendance must have been attained prior to the date of the Election Meeting.

NOTE: Where a Branch enacts a Regulation for this purpose, it will be necessary that it keep an accurate record of attendance of all Members present at General Meetings.

- 405. (1) No Member who is a full time, regular part time or elect to work employee of any Branch or Command or any organization thereof, who receives directly or indirectly any salary or wages for or on account of any service rendered to the Branch or Command or any organization thereof, shall be eligible to hold any Executive position in the Branch. Any employee as defined in this section who is successful in his bid for office must resign his paid position before his Term of Office can commence.
 - (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, Members of the Ladies' Auxiliary employed by the Branch or Command may, at the discretion of the Branch or Command, hold Office in the Auxiliary.
- 406. No Member shall hold more than one elected Office in the Branch.
- 407. The Offices of Secretary and Treasurer shall not be held by the President or any of the Vice-Presidents.
- 408. The President shall not hold the position of Ladies' Auxiliary Liaison Officer.
- 409. The Term of Office shall be for one (1) year unless Branch Regulations make provision for a two (2) year term.
- 410. [NOT INCLUDED – Para 410 deals with subsequent appointments after the Elections]







INTRODUCING VETERAN SONIA KAMEL

In 1967 graduated Registered Nurse, Comrade Sonia enlisted in the air force on the basis of a Short Service Commission (a temporary contractual military career). Basic training at Camp Borden was followed by a one-year posting at the Stadacona Naval Base in Halifax. From there, Comrade Sonia was posted to an army hospital in Iserlohn, northern Germany for the next one and one half years. This hospital was under British Command which included the Canadian Medical Corps. With a posting back to Canada, Comrade Sonia spent the next four years with the National Defence Medical Centre in Ottawa.

Comrade Sonia grew up in a small farming community south of Winnipeg but knew early in life that she wanted to travel and experience world adventures. She said, *"I knew I made the right decision; I have never regretted joining the military; it's something every person should experience."*

At Camp Borden, Comrade Sonia participated in learning new skills, particularly in the realm of military administration and memoranda/report writing which were non-medical in nature. This was a challenge but these new proficiencies were vital to her continued success. Comrade Sonia joined the air force as a Pilot Officer and continued up the ranks. When Comrade Sonia decided to pursue civilian life, she left the military with the rank of Captain.

Comrade Sonia was one of two dozen registered nurses who worked at the British-Canadian hospital in Iserlohn providing health care to the enlisted personnel and their families. Working together with the British Military Nurse Midwives, Comrade Sonia's duties included looking after the pre-and-post natal needs of the women living on and off base. Captain Kamel worked twelve-hour shifts and as such, had compensating off-duty time which allowed her to travel to numerous European destinations. In addition she visited the Scandinavian countries and counts Cyprus and Lebanon in her list of travels.

Comrade Sonia kept in touch with family by letter and when time and space were available on military flights, she would take advantage of the opportunities to travel home. She has no complaints and states they had all the necessary equipment for their work and the meals were better than expected. While in Germany, Comrade Sonia lived on 'economy' meaning she lived off-base, and stated that the cost was *"very reasonable."* Personnel at this base in northern Germany were offered additional compensation

consideration as working in this area was (then) considered semi-isolation.

Comrade Sonia shared some indelible memories. She spoke of the fragility of life and sadly recalls the unpredicted complications of a routine surgery and the difficult moment of having to inform the family of the death. She


also recalls Check-Point Charlie (Berlin's best known crossing point between East and West Berlin from 1961 to 1969).

At the end of her Short Service Commission (SSC), Comrade Sonia decided to continue with her academic studies. She holds a Certificate in Public Service, and a Bachelor of Arts Degree (combined major) in Political Science and Economics. In civilian life, Comrade Sonia worked for the Anti-Inflation Board, the Federal Transport Commission and in transportation for the Provincial Government including focus on the transportation needs for persons with disabilities.

During the interview, Comrade Sonia shared, *"It is important that we give proper recognition to the value of a Veteran. We must never forget that the many freedoms we take for granted are as a result of a lot of hardships along the way."* She is pleased that our young people are being educated through our Youth Education program and feels reassured knowing that we have an active Service Officer.

In closing, Comrade Sonia said, *"It's a bonus that our Branch is in the center of our community offering easy access for everyone."* Comrade Sonia shared that the generic nature of the interview questions allowed her to reminisce in a comfortable manner.


