### VETERANS SERVICE OFFICER REPORT

Submitted by Comrade Randy Rice, Veterans Service Officer Letters have been sent to all Veterans of the branch outlining Veterans Service Officer responsibilities and services available to them through Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) and the Royal Canadian Legion. An accompanying letter was also included about the acknowledgement, apology and compensation by the federal government for our Second World War Metis Veterans.

Effective April 1, 2019, Disability Awards were replaced by the Pain and Suffering Compensation.

Did you know VAC has an Education and Training Benefit. As of March 31, 2019, 1,072 Veterans are recipients at a cost of \$12.3 million. Projected for 2019 -2020, 2,400 Veterans enrolled at a cost of \$44 million. For details call 1-866-522-2122. A Veteran who is a close friend of mine recently applied and was approved despite being retired for over 20 years.

The growing number of VETERANS requiring assistance from VAC is significantly increasing yearly, stretching VAC personnel's ability to provide services in a timely manner. As a result, currently there are 44,000 cases waiting to be addressed or adjudicated causing a backlog of two or more years.

# VETERANS HELPING VETERANS WITH THE LEGION'S OSI BUDDY CHECK COFFEE

The Royal Canadian Legion Operational Stress Injury Special Section (BSO Legion OSI) has launched a program to help Veterans gather to enjoy peer support, while sipping coffee.

Buddy Check Coffee is a Veteran run program offering comradeship in a relaxed environment, allowing for networking and sharing of experiences and stories.

"It can make a difference for so many veterans," says Chris Richardson, co-founder of the Legion's OSI Special Section and its newest program, Buddy Check Coffee. "I'm excited to see the program launch nationally."

Chris is an 11-year veteran of the Canadian Forces with service in the Gulf War, UN Cyprus, NATO, submarines and ships. He joined the Legion in 2015.

Joe Elliott, 22-year Gulf War Veteran of the Royal Navy, is another co-founder of the Legion's OSI Special Section and of Buddy Check Coffee.

"I joined the Legion and immediately found myself making connections and meeting other Veterans," says Elliott. "I found that just going for a cup of coffee and checking in with each other was so good for my mental health and my fellow Veterans. We started doing this on red Fridays in Prince George and called it Buddy Check Coffee. My hope is Veterans will start connecting and supporting each other as only our Veteran Brothers and Sisters can."

The program is currently looking for coordinators to start Buddy Check Coffee in communities across Canada.

Program coordinators must be a Canadian Armed Forces or RCMP Veteran (retired or still serving), have or be willing to take the Mental Health First Aid Course for Veterans, and be a Legion member with membership in BSO Legion OSI (free for Legion members). 



# INTRODUCING LADIES AUXILIARY LIFE MEMBER ANNIE COOMBS

In 1979-1980, a friend introduced Comrade Annie to our Branch 270 Ladies Auxiliary. Her father served in the army during the Second World War and was posted overseas from 1940 to 1945.

Now an octogenarian, in the past, Comrade Annie was responsible for the Banquet Room and table set up. This was her area of expertise.

After more than twenty years of continuous service, Comrade Annie was wonderfully surprised at the honour of being recognized as a Life Member. During this interview she mentioned that she would never have entered any Branch were she not an Auxiliary member. Annie shared that she believes the top most purpose of the Ladies Auxiliary organization is to be of service to the Branch, Veterans and the community. It's necessary.

Comrade Annie would like to involve younger women but understands that many ladies now work several jobs and are a driving-service for their children from one activity to another. This leaves for little volunteer time. She did comment that it wouldn't hurt for the L.A. organization to show the younger women that volunteering once in a while could be their personal down time; an opportunity to share with other like-minded women. She would like to see a Ladies Auxiliary booth at the Coldwater fall fair and at other community events.

She fondly remembers when the Branch/Auxiliary would transfer our Veterans and members from our Branch to another Branch in our Zone for the afternoon. It was not unusual to have a busload of forty or more persons participate in such an event. In addition, she recalls when the Branch and the Auxiliary would jointly host dances in the upstairs Banquet Room.

Comrade Annie remembers the 'skirted' days and is happy that the Ladies now have the option of wearing a skirt or a pair of slacks. There is a need to consider a seasonal uniform. Referring to uniform, she stated that the cost of the uniform can be prohibitive and discourage membership. As such, one jacket (be it for Branch/Auxiliary) with removable badges. There should be a sharing of available uniforms between the Branch and the Auxiliary.

Lady Annie, we thank you.



### **CLUBHOUSE RULES – NOTICE OF MOTION**

A new version of the Branch Clubhouse Rules has been worked on by the Branch 270 Executive and is ready to be approved by the membership. Any changes to Rules, Regulations & By-Laws require that a formal Notice of Motion be given first, so that a vote can take place at the following General Meeting.



### PROPOSED BRANCH CLUBHOUSE RULES

These rules have been authorized by the elected Branch Executive. A complaint by a Legion/Ladies Auxiliary member against another member must be in accordance with Legion Complaint and Appeal Procedure Para 301 to 314 inclusive, of Article III, The General By-Laws manual.

### Scope

These rules detail, regulate and govern the conduct of Legion/Ladies Auxiliary members and guests while on the premises. These rules apply to all members of Branch 270 and guests. These rules are referenced to and are captioned in Para 304 sub paras a-i and a-ii of the Legion Complaint and Appeal Procedure. They are referred to as Clubhouse rules in the aforementioned manual.

### Definitions

<u>Branch 270</u> all that is on Legion Property

<u>Clubhouse</u> the premises occupied by the Legion branch

<u>Club Room</u> areas inside the branch where alcohol is served

<u>Canteen</u> the privately leased food operation colocated on the premises.

#### Rules

- 1. Branch Privileges shall be extended to all Branch Members and Ladies Auxiliary in good standing.
- 2. Upon request of the bar steward a Legion membership card must be shown.
- Steward on duty is in charge of the Club Room at all times.
- 4. Behind the bar is out-of-bounds to all personnel unless otherwise authorized.
- 5. Unauthorized gambling is not permitted in the Branch.
- 6. Children under the age of 14 are not allowed in the Games Room. Further, minors must be supervised at all times while on the premises. All minors must exit the Club Room by 8:00 p.m. The Executive may override this rule for special events.
- 7. All games shall be terminated and beverages consumed within 30 minutes of the bar closing.
- 8. Suspected intoxicated persons will not be served further alcoholic beverages and may be requested to leave the premises. Additionally, no person shall purchase alcoholic beverages for that previously mentioned patron(s). If the patron(s) refuses to leave, the bar steward is authorized to close the bar until resolution of the problem is reached.
- Members, guests and service providers will show respect for one another by refraining from foul, abusive, discourteous language. Conversation, debates and discourse between parties must be courteous and contained. Respect is the key.
- 10. Harassment of any kind will not be tolerated.
- Torn, ripped, skimpy, or offensive apparel and bare feet will not be tolerated. If found unacceptable, the offender will be asked to leave by the bar steward.

12. Possession, trafficking or use of illegal substances as defined by the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act of Canada shall not be tolerated on Branch premises.

13. During the canteen's hours of operation, food brought in from the outside may not be consumed on the premises. Bar stewards or other Branch staff on duty are exempted. From time to time other situations will occur where the Branch Executive may suspend this rule for special occasions.

#### Courtesies

Members and guests are encouraged to:

- Remove headdress when entering the Club Room, except when part of ones duties or part of religious apparel. The Executive may override this for special occasions such as Christmas, St. Patrick's or costume parties.
- 2. Return their empty bottles to the beer cases and their glasses to the bar.
- **3.** Invite those sitting alone to join you for comradeship at your table, and offer a friendly hello to all members and guests coming through the door.


