On the morning of the branch election, Sunday May 6, Branch President Betty-Jean Murray laid a wreath at the Coldwater Cenotaph to commemorate the Battle of the Atlantic. While Battle of the Atlantic commemoration ceremonies have been taking place annually all across the country in recent years, this simple wreath laying seems to be the first time in memory that this particular battle was commemorated in Coldwater. It shouldn't be the last time. Battle of the Atlantic is commemorated every year on the first Sunday in May, which is also the day of our annual branch election.

An estimate for a brass plaque with the names of the 23 soldiers from Coldwater killed in action during the First World War is in progress. The plan is to unveil the plaque during the Remembrance Day ceremony at the Cenotaph on November 11, which will mark the 100th anniversary of the 1918 Armistice. A formal proposal will be presented next month.

Preamble:

- The Royal Canadian Legion was formed in response to a personal appeal made to exservicemen and women by First Field Marshall Earl Haig;
- His objective was to unite ex-service personnel of the Empire;
- For this purpose he founded the British Empire Service League, a central organization uniting Empire ex-service personnel;
- Under the Constitution of the League, an association may only represent each particular country within the Empire;
- In Canada the recognized association is the Royal Canadian Legion.

Now, all about us...

1935 – January 2nd – Coldwater Legion Branch 270 received their Charter; First Legion Hall was the old doctor's office on River Street; First Branch President was Thomas Langton;

1952 – Branch moved to Rose Manning House on Sturgeon Bay Road across the street from Graystone Manor;

1962 – Branch moved to the old hotel at the corner of Main Street and Mill Road;

1971 – November 11th – Branch moved to 2 Michael Anne Drive;

1987 – November 11th – corner stone was laid for addition to present building;

1988 – June 2nd – official opening of addition.



INTRODUCING MEMBER FRANK PECK

After working in private industry for several years, Comrade Frank answered a hiring drive across Ontario and Canada for police recruits. Moving from the private sector to the public sector was aided by his family background. His greatgrandfather, grandfather and father were in lawenforcement. These positive role models made the choice of community service work 'a natural transition'. In 1966 he took that leap of faith and attended the Toronto Police Academy and never looked back.

Born in 1944, Comrade Frank graduated from the Police Academy in Willowdale in 1967 and was promptly assigned to 52 Division of the Metropolitan Toronto Police Services Board where he served the community for the next thirty years.

In the intervening years, Comrade Frank worked in the Motorcycle Detachment, on Beat Duty and with Patrol Cars. He qualified as a Training Officer and worked as an Undercover Plain Clothes Officer and performed Cell Block duties. His last eleven years of service were spent in the Detective Office performing general investigative duties mainly with the Coroner's Office.

Constable Peck recalls his early days as exciting and interesting. But there were challenges along the way. Working three shifts, recognizing the scope of the homelessness situation, the number of robberies and learning who to trust was an eye-opener. Partnering with an experienced Officer for two years, he learned the intricacies of being not only a person of law enforcement but a vital part of the community. Later in his career, he offered the same guidance to new recruits.

With sadness he remembers losing his partner to a fatal shooting incident but fondly remembers working on a world-wide basis for many years in an attempt to find the identity of a *John Doe*.

After retirement, Comrade Frank relocated to Coldwater and pursued part-time work with the City of Orillia repairing and replacing parking meters. He received a Certificate of Appreciation from the then Mayor of Orillia. Comrade Frank is the recipient of many recognition certificates and plaques including but not limited to his 30year Long Service Medal, the Metropolitan Toronto Police Association Legal Services Plan Fund, and the Police Association Monitor. He continues to 'stay in touch' with the latest in the Association's police work through daily email updates.
